Neighbor Ape Projects

Since Neighbor Ape was initiated in 2008, we have been involved in various projects that support people in rural southeastern Senegal. These include:

1. Providing a year's supply of school supplies to the village of Djendji (2010 and 2011). (Photo of graduate student helping present school supplies to elders and teachers of the village of Djendji in October 2011).



2. Building a well for potable drinking water in the village of Fongoli, Senegal. (Photo of well builder and moulds used to shore up the walls of the well).



3. Providing mosquito nets to the village of Fongoli (yearly, since 2009) (Photo of typical outdoor shelter, with mosquito net, at Fongoli, Senegal).



4. Supporting children from rural southeastern Senegal in school in Kedougou (Catholic mission school), Tambacounda (Catholic Mission school) and Dakar (nursing school). This support has been ongoing since 2006 and has varied in terms of the number of students supported, usually from 7-9 students.
