



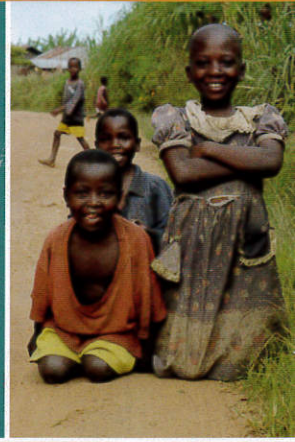

EMERGENCY CARE IS A NEGLECTED PUBLIC HEALTH CHALLENGE IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA.

Despite large sums of money being spent on preventative public health measures, life expectancy is still significantly lower than in high-income countries. This is largely because the mortality rates from treatable diseases and preventable injury remain high, often because access to quality emergency care doesn't exist.



GLOBAL EMERGENCY CARE COLLABORATIVE

(GECC), a 501c3 nonprofit organization, has pioneered Emergency Care Practitioner (ECP) training programs in southwest Uganda, where doctors are scarce. Local Ugandan nurses are trained in emergency care services, so that they can save lives and prevent disability for thousands of patients whom otherwise would not be able to access this level of care in a timely manner. These ECPs then take ownership of the training program by teaching the next course of ECPs, creating a scalable, sustainable emergency care system.
