

Children who complete more education are more likely to be EMPLOYED, earn MORE MONEY, have BETTER HEALTH, and even LIVE LONGER.



At-risk students in Indianapolis charters learn more in a year than traditional public school (TPS) peers, says a 2019 Stanford study. This is represented as "equivalent days of learning" in a year.

5th graders in Indianapolis mayor-sponsored charter schools had ISTEP+ scores that were on average:



Indiana brick & mortar charters^{*} serve higher percentages of at-risk students than their local traditional public schools (TPS) and these students outperform their local TPS peers, a 2018 Indiana State Board of Education report revealed.



Brick & Mortar Charters have higher average pass rates than local TPS for:

- Low Income Students
- Black Students
- Hispanic Students
- Multi-Racial Students; and
- English Language Learners.



*Brick & mortar charters exclude virtual charters, adult high schools, and special population charters like those serving students with severe cognitive disabilities or those battling addiction.





Achieving stronger educational outcomes with a higher percentage of at-risk students.

Christel House Academies serve at-risk populations at a substantially higher rate than the state or IPS average. Despite serving a higher proportion of at-risk students, CHAS students are far more likely to graduate with an honors diploma than the IPS or the state-wide average.



Christel House Academies regularly outperform IPS and the state on ISTEP pass rates for key at-risk demographics.





of 2018 Christel House Academy South (CHAS) graduates earned acceptance letters to 4-year colleges. of Christel House Academy South graduates are working and/or continuing their studies.



of 2016 CHAS graduates started postsecondary within 1 year compared to 47% from IPS and 64% across Indiana.
