### **Opportunity to Promote Access to Justice In China**

I am writing to invite you to participate in an exciting new pro bono program to strengthen the capacity of Chinese public defenders to secure access to justice for their clients, the Chinese Defender Training for Trainers Program (the "Chinese Defender Program"). The program is co-sponsored by International Bridges to Justice ("IBJ") and the Public Defender Service for the District of Columbia ("PDS") and hosted by the Greater Washington IBJ Community of Conscience ("GWCoC"). The Chinese Defender Program, to be held in Washington, D.C. for the two week period from January 20, 2007 to February 4, 2007, will serve as a national model for replication in other cities.

### The Problem: Denial of Justice in China

Access to justice including representation by legal counsel and fair legal process is a fundamental requirement of a just society. Despite recent legal reforms under Chinese law, the right to access to justice remains elusive for most Chinese citizens, especially the poor and minorities. Many citizens continue to face arbitrary detention, torture and denial of access to a fair trial. Chinese public defenders are at the forefront of the struggle in China to further the rule of law by promoting greater access to justice.

## Strengthening the Capacity of Chinese Public Defenders

The Chinese Defender Program will train Chinese public defenders in applicable trial advocacy skills to enhance their capability to ensure access to justice. The program will provide a select number of Chinese legal aid lawyers with training in essential trial advocacy skills by some of Washington, D.C.'s best public and private lawyers. Additionally, this program will inspire Chinese public defenders to play a more active role in the criminal process by illustrating the essential role of a vigorous and independent defense. As part of the training program, these lawyers will also be trained to train other criminal defenders to improve and excel in the defense of the indigent accused. In this way, International Bridges to Justice and its D.C. partners can ensure that the program will not only train a core team of lawyers to advocate for their individual clients more effectively, but have a broader impact on the development of China's criminal justice system.
