

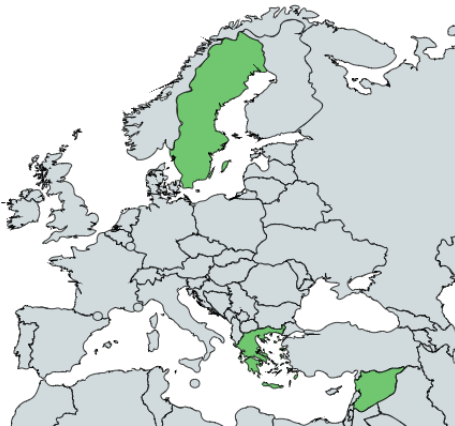

At the core of Jafra Foundation are our programs and projects. We engage with communities in various stages of rebuilding, repairing and re-establishment.

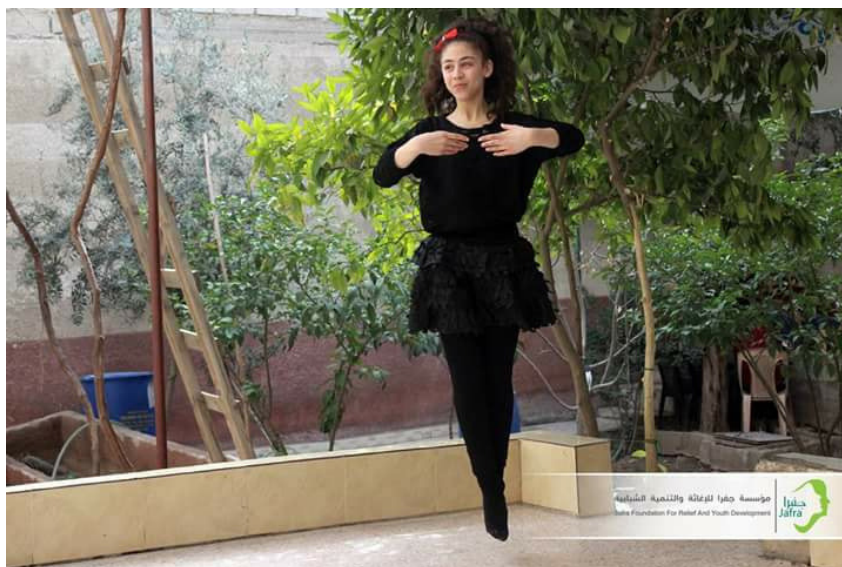


SYRIA OPERATIONAL CONTEXT

Education Programs

Our goal is to provide children and youths with access to quality education, so they can pave their way to a better future. Education protects, empowers and enlightens children and youths, helping their households and communities to recover from crises by increasing their resilience.

Jafra provides non-formal educational opportunities for children and youth aged 4 years to 22 years old. We oversee the provision of school books, stationery and uniforms for students. With the aim of implementing a holistic approach, Jafra frequently conducts “Back to Learning” campaigns to raise awareness to both children and caregivers on the importance and right to education.



Jafra Foundation staff are qualified and well-trained using best pedagogical instruction. While the primary role of teachers is to facilitate knowledge, they are also responsible in building a warm environment, mentoring and nurturing students, in turn and becoming role models for students.

Child Protection

Jafra Foundation for Relief and Youth Development is committed to safeguarding children from harm by striving to create safe, supportive and positive environments for children. Having Child Protection instilled as our core strategy, we offer a Child Protection program in all our areas of operation through provisioning several related services.

Jafra and its partners provide various trainings to all Child Protection program staff, including but not limited to: Structured Psychosocial Program, Structured Recreational Activities, Safe Identification and Referral, Monitoring & Evaluation.

Youth Programs

At our very core, Jafra Foundation is a commitment to the youth empowerment; enabling them to build better futures. Through trainings and education we develop their skills and enhance their knowledge.

- Three Key Pillars of Jafra Foundations Youth Programming:
- 1) Capacity Building - (management & strategic planning, project management cycle, human resources development, financial management...etc)
 - 2) Soft Skills - foreign languages and computer skills
 - 3) Life Skills - communication skills, behaviour modification and leadership skills

Social Cohesion



With conflict, societies are torn apart and communication amongst parties and individuals is obstructed.

Jafra recently supported Local committees in Damascus, South Damascus, Yarmouk and Khan El Sheih with trainings and guidance to help them identify better ways forward and meet the needs of their communities, as well as communicate and advocate positively and effectively with local authorities.

Shelter

Providing shelter in a crisis is an essential part of the humanitarian response; it ensures privacy, dignity and safety, strengthening the resilience of individuals and communities.

Our Shelter Program

Consists of:

- Provision of tents and shelter kits and materials such as plastic sheets that can be used to build a simple shelter
- Rehabilitation of communal shelters
- Rehabilitation of Education Spaces and Community Spaces



WASH

Apart from food and shelter, water and sanitation are among the urgent needs in an emergency. The interrupted access to clean water and sanitation services, paralleled with absence of good hygiene practices, can lead to disease outbreak, endangering the population's health and survival.

Jafra Foundation WASH Programs are implemented as follows: Waste Management, water provision and hygiene awareness sessions

Health



Poor health weakens the population's resilience and their ability to rebuild and develop their communities. With the help of our partners, we established our Health Program to respond to the urgent emerging needs.

Pharmacy, Primary Health Care Center, counselling, health education and promotion, drug provision, case management, First Aid training, distribution of mobility aids for people with disabilities.

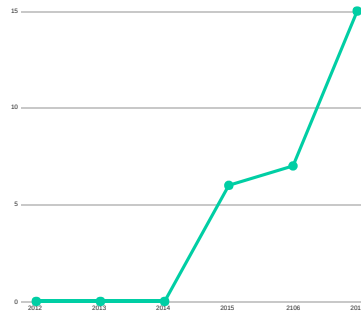
Cultural Sustainability

Food Security is achieved “when all people, at all times, have physical, social and economic access to sufficient, safe and nutritious food that meets their dietary needs and food preferences for an active and healthy life”.

With our diverse programs, our aim is to relieve poverty, improve economic well-being and build people’s capacities to restore their livelihoods

and strengthen their resilience. Since 2012, and entering into the eighth year of conflict in Syria, Jafra Foundation has recognised the need to empower and sustain local communities by way of Food Security and Livelihood projects. Whilst the need for Emergency Response is still prevalent, livelihood projects enable individuals to recover, rebuild and contribute to their individual and family's livelihoods.

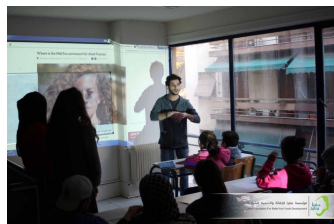

Programs and Services in Greece:

- . **Women's Shelter** including support for English language classes and health education
- . **Drop-In Centre** distributing medicine, food and baby needs
- . **Aid Distribution** meeting the needs of families with food and sanitary needs
- . **Children and Youth Programs** offering psycho-social support and an arts and cultural program
- . **Individualised Family Support** for 40 families with children with special needs
- . **Capacity Building Training** for volunteers including strategic planning training and language classes

Jafra Response in Sweden:



With the Syrian crisis continuing to displace hundreds of thousands of people, many staff and volunteers from **Jafra Foundation** have sought refuge in other countries, including

Sweden, in Europe. In 2015, **Jafra Foundation** launched its first response in Sweden and continues to support staff and volunteers, who are refugees themselves, in celebrating the Palestinian culture through **Youth** and **Cultural Sustainability** programs and projects.

Youth Programs

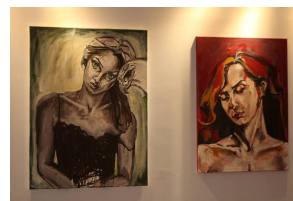
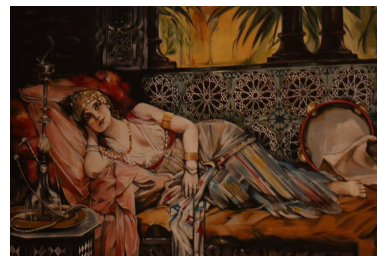
