- **Survivor Testimonies** – we need to urgently film the testimonies of the remaining Survivors because they are all in their later years and time is running out
- **Materials** – we need to add hundreds of thousands of people's names and information to the Wall of Tribute and to preserve and exhibit their photos and documents in the Hall of Memories
- **Funding** – we need funding to complete the Virtual Museum's development and to keep it online for future generations

Even with unpaid volunteers, the Virtual Museum costs tens of thousands of dollars per year to run

- Paying for necessary I.T., charity registration, book-keeping and administrative costs
- Filming and producing remaining Survivor Testimony interviews
- Processing the back-log of 100 interviews already filmed
- Scanning historical photographs and documents
- Adding tens of thousands of persons to the the Wall of Tribute
- Completing work on the Virtual Museum's Historical Galleries, Special Exhibitions and their translations
- Presenting educational events, exhibitions and conferences

Mission and core purpose

“To research, remember and recognize Poland’s citizens fighting for freedom and survival in eastern Poland and in forced exile during World War II.”

The Kresy-Siberia Group has diverse members

- We are World War II Survivors and their descendants, from various ethnic and religious backgrounds
- We hail from “**Kresowians**” from Poland’s eastern borderlands, from “**Sybiraks**” deported to Soviet forced labor and from “**Kombatants**” fighting in the Polish Armed Forces in Exile during World War II
- Our ranks include people from all walks of life, including professional writers, educators, historians, film-producers, archivists and researchers
- We have over 1000 members world-wide, aged from 20 to over 80, with new members joining each week

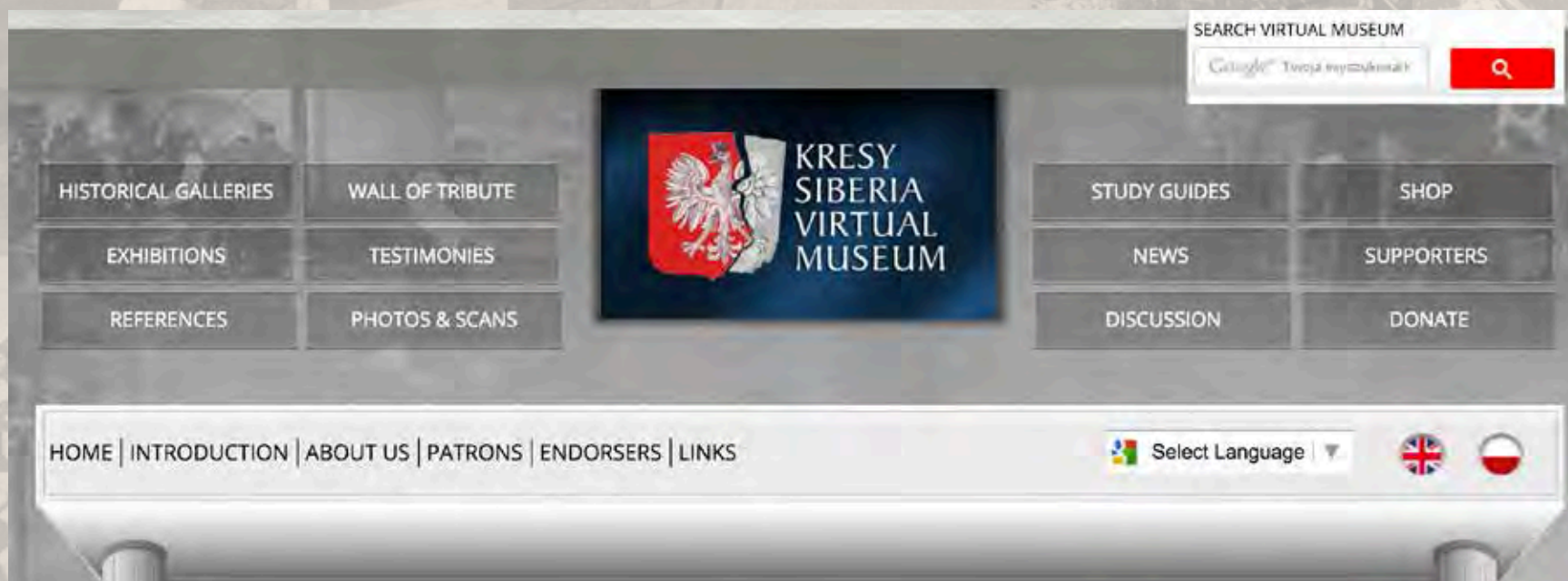

The Virtual Museum builds bridges of knowledge and understanding of personal and national histories

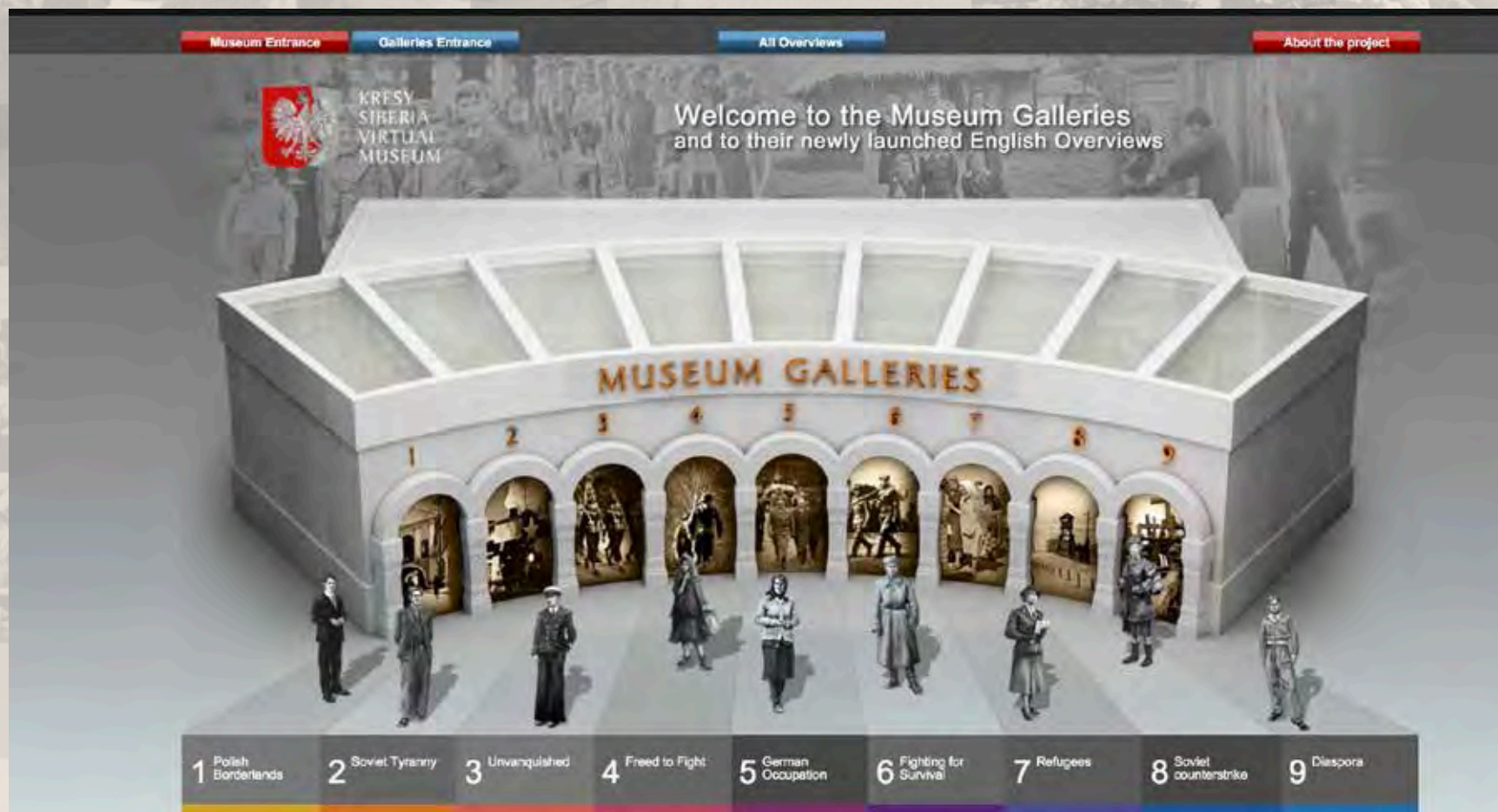
- It preserves and communicates, in both Polish and English, the little-known history and experiences of our families, Poland's heroic World War II generation
