Refugio Rafael

Located in a Quechuan community in Marquina, Bolivia, people in this Andes Mountain area provide for their families through roadside markets and day labor. Living conditions are simple. Clothes are washed by hand. Small vegetable gardens and chickens provide food. Meals are prepared on small propane burners. Plumbing and electricity are limited.

The Refugio is a unique community support facility, staffed by local people and assisted by international partners. It provides education, economic development, medical assistance, and homes for single moms and their children.



The Refugio provides work space and mentors for artisans to develop handcrafts and goods for international and local markets.

Health/Wellness Program: Provides health education and medical support for community members.
