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BACKGROUND AND HISTORY OF THE ORGANISATION

Hamilton Saba Foundation was founded by Hamilton Saba and his wife Naomi Saba. It is a a non-profit organisation registered in March 2016 with Department of Social Development and its main focus is on empowerment of youth and women in South Africa due to global problems.

Founder (Hamilton Saba) is a qualified Pastor with Doctrate in Theology and a qualified and experienced Trainer and Assessor accredited by FP & M Seta. He has experience working with government departments on projects for Working for Fire, Department of Water and Sanitation previously known as Department of Water Affairs.

Co-Founder (Naomi Saba) is qualified and experienced Finance Manager, Assessor accredited by FP & M Seta and ISO 9000 quality assurance auditor for +/- 28 years. She has worked with local and int. NGO's, like Habitat for Humanity Int. and Amref Health on projects for maternal health, communicable and non-communicable diseases, etc.

Hamilton Saba Foundation since its existence has been busy with different projects and one of the highlight projects introduced in 2018/19 was WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) in schools situated in Maquassi Hills Local Municipality, North West Province and plan to spread provincially. According to the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, Act no. 108 of 1996, Section 10 states that every person has inherent dignity and the right to have their dignity respected and protected. Section 24 (a) states that everyone has the right to an environment that is not harmful to their health or well being.

Hamilton Saba Foundation source of income will be through raising funds and requesting sponsorships from government, public and private companies and forming different partnerships with these entities.

MISSION

Hamilton Saba Foundation aims to help solve the problems raised by 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with a focus on SDG 6 (Clean water and sanitation). Hamilton Saba Foundation works on a dialogue with Maquassi Hill WASH Task Team that comprise of relevant Government Stakeholders, Maquassi Hills Local Municipality, Sedibeng Water, etc. and provides multi-stakeholder solutions (private, public, civil society...) around issues of human rights, security through the development of service providers who provide basic services to the most vulnerable populations, in particular through access to safe drinking water.

VISION

- Access to safe water and sanitation.
- Impact investing in saving water as a solution to solve global problems.

THE MAIN OBJECTIVE

The main objective of this project is to empower the learners and community about the importance of saving water, sanitation and hygiene.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Hamilton Saba Foundation wishes to implement this project which seeks to improve school attendance by reducing illness-related absenteeism due to poor water and sanitation conditions, and will include amongst other things, training school governing bodies, teachers, learners and volunteers, in order to support the hygiene plan implementation (the HSF Project).

Hamilton Saba Foundation in future would like to cover more schools in North West Province and South Africa, but the challenge is funding.

GOALS

The project focus is to train:-

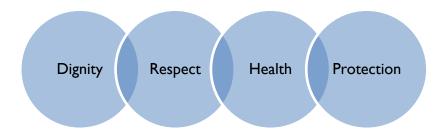
- School Governing Bodies (SGB"s) on planning for and taking forward WASH activities at schools (assume 1 SGB member per school).
- Focal teachers on WASH programming good hygiene education (assume 2 teachers per school).
- Learners on WASH programming good hygiene education as peer educators so that they are able to support WASH implementation and train other learners (assume 5 learners per school).
- EPWP/CWP workers on planning for and taking forward WASH activities at schools (assume 2 EPWP/CWP workers per school).

PROJECT RESULTS

Support of this project will result in:-

- A thorough needs assessment for schools on their WASH requirements.
- Established WASH infrastructure in schools.
- Established WASH activity plans for implementation by various schools.
- Trained SGB members, teachers, learners and EPWP/CWP workers on WASH activities, programming good hygiene education.
- Clean toilets and water conservation.

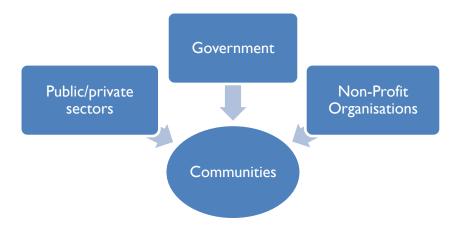

MONITORING AND EVALUATION

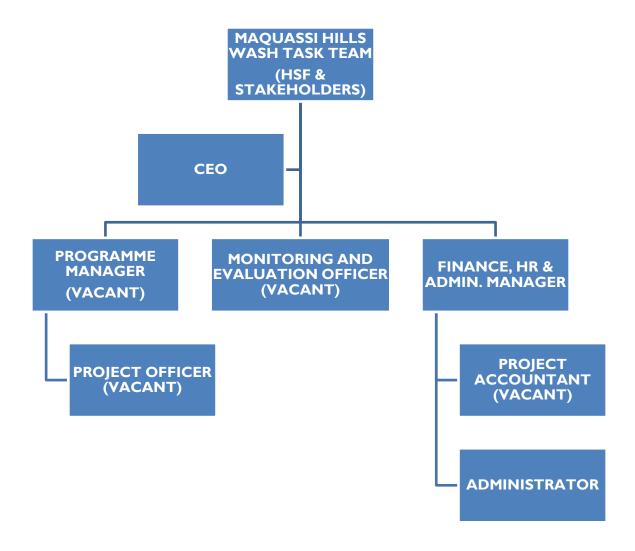
- Establishment of WASH Task Team that will consists of all relevant stakeholders to ensure proper implementation and sustainability of the project.
