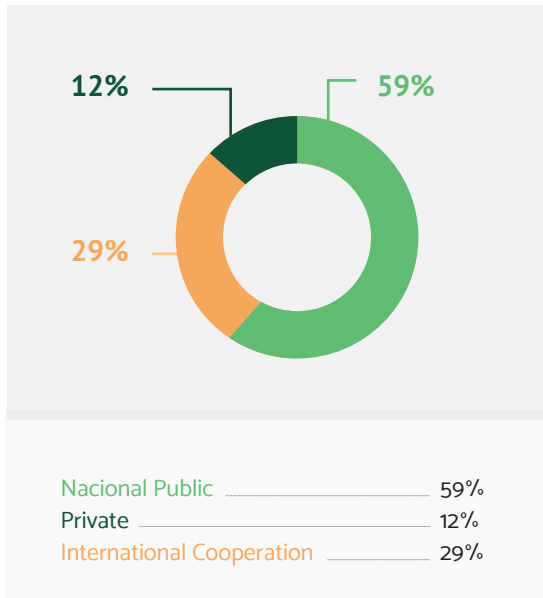

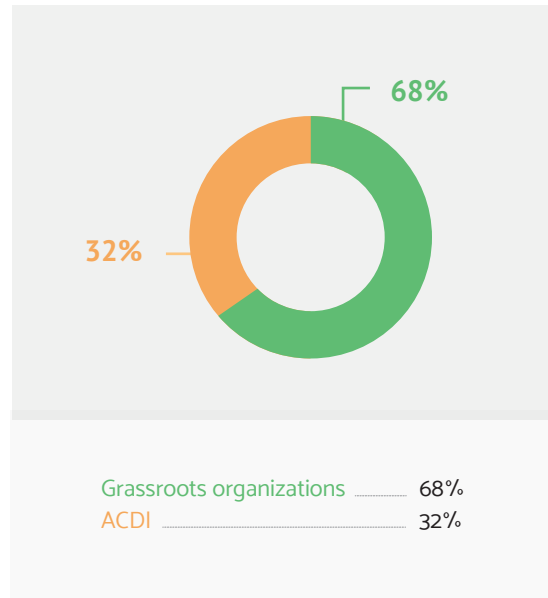

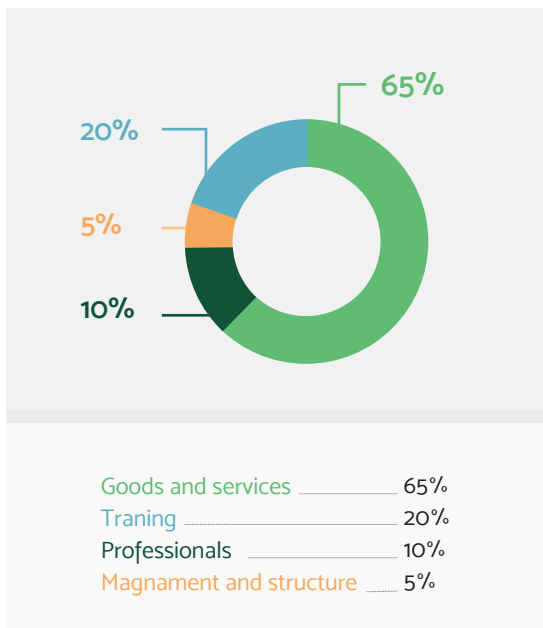

BECAUSE development is linked to the duties that arise from the relationship between the human being and the environment.



Poverty and the environment have a circular relationship. Environmental deterioration deepens poverty and poverty increases environmental deterioration. Environmental quality determines, in part, living conditions, the state of health and vulnerability of people.

The Gran Chaco region is identified as the most vulnerable in Argentina in terms of social and environmental indicators. This great biome is present in seven provinces and it is shared with Bolivia and Paraguay, representing the second largest forested mass in Latin America.

WHAT?

We design, test and scale new business models that address human development and climate challenges at the same time.

- We promote social, technological and business innovation.
- We mobilize, articulate and channel investments and credits to business models that promote sustainable, competitive and inclusive development, adding the local value of natural, social and cultural capital.
- We combine innovation with local knowledge.

HOW?

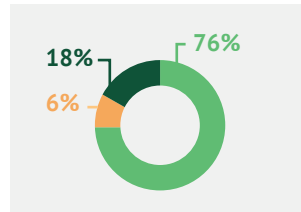
- Apporting an educational differential, knowledge and technologies to generate a qualitative leverage in production and commercialisation.

BECAUSE we believe that work is
a human need.

In the first trimester of 2020, **unemployment in Argentina rose to 10.4%**. Before the quarantine there were already more than two million people without work. Unemployment affects young people more than adults: according to INDEC data, the unemployment rate for young people is more than double that of the adult population in general. Argentina is the country with the highest youth unemployment in the region. On the other hand, **unemployment affects more the young people**

who most need to work: those from lower-income households. Gender is another factor linked to work vulnerability: 25% of young women are unemployed compared to 15.4% of men. Added to this is the incidence of informality. In Argentina, **34% of workers are in a situation of informality**, but if only young workers are considered, that percentage rises to 60%, that is, **six out of ten young people who work do so in a precarious way.**

WHAT?

- We look after youth and adults in social vulnerability, addressing them to acquire **Hard, Soft & Business Skills**, prioritizing emerging jobs and demands.
- We promote ventures that contribute to **solve local problems and the systemic competitiveness** of marginal regions.
- In highly fragile contexts, we **develop processes of accompaniment, empowerment and social inclusion**, promoting social protection.

WHERE?

In the provinces of **Jujuy, Tucuman and Misiones** since 2016.

HOW?

- **With an unwavering confidence in people**, in their infinite possibilities and irreducible desire for freedom and personal growth.
- **In partnership with the public sector** to collaborate with social promotion and employment policies.
- **In partnership with the Science and Technology system** to promote innovation.
- **In partnership with the private sector** to launch new business models that address local problems by creating job opportunities.

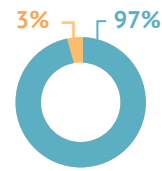

BECAUSE there is no greater demonstration of love for humanity than educational commitment.

Studies and facts prove the effectiveness of education to overcome the intergenerational transfer of poverty. Education improves critical reflection, access to decent jobs, health and family planning. In Argentina, almost 1 out of 2 children (0 to 14 years old) is poor. This implies that 6.3 million children are disadvantaged in their right to access

education. In addition, there is a remarkable inequality of educational opportunities. Children living in poor contexts have difficulties to access and fully enjoy the educational system. Drop out rate higher in this contexts and those who finish school do not reach adequate educational levels.

WHAT?

- We improve and expand the social-educational services of civil organizations committed to the educational challenge in contexts of social vulnerability.
- We develop actions that accompany and motivate children in their educational path.
- We strengthen educational institutions engaged with “the social and geographical peripheries”, from the material to the pedagogical.

WHERE?

Provinces of Santa Fe, Entre Ríos, Salta, Mendoza, Chaco, and Buenos Aires.

HOW?

- Through a comprehensive approach to education, broadening the horizon of cultural, recreational, pedagogical and affective experiences to reverse the sense of social inferiority and generate experiences of participation and enhancement of individual skills.
- Promoting the participation of civil society to address the educational challenge together with the state and families.
- Accompanying families to foster the educational responsibility of adults towards children.

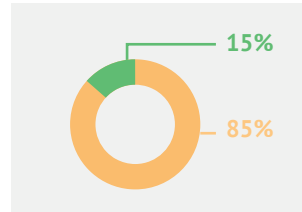
