Transformational stories of impact - our children

Jeet's Story

In July 2017, six-year-old Jeet joined Peepul's exemplar school in Lajpat Nagar, in Class 1. This was the fourth government school that his parents were trying to send him to – no school seemed to want to keep him. He was a disruptive child, they said, always causing trouble and never in the classroom. He had a speech **impairment**, and the other kids made fun of him when he spoke – and so, he spoke with his fists, and with insults.

The adults in Jeet's life had not been predictable – loving one day, abusive the next. And so, Jeet didn't trust adults. He was defensive and combative on the outside - but just a scared, scarred small boy on the inside. Having learnt from his 'friends in the park', he now had become a bully. In the first few weeks in our Peepul school, you would find him roaming the corridors, or walking into other classrooms, heckling other kids.

Our Peepul teachers set about slowly building his trust, using their deep understanding of child psychology and behaviour. management.

They helped him see that his actions had rewards or sanctions – and that it was nothing personal. They gently made him realize he was part of the school community. They laid out clearly what exemplary behaviour looked like, and rewarded him for making progress towards exemplary behaviour. And when he did something wrong, they made him see that they didn't stop loving him or think he was a bad person – they only disapproved of his actions.

Two years into his being in our school, **Jeet is an attentive learner**. He is an enthusiastic member of his class and particularly enjoys mathematics and art classes. He is articulate and makes it a point to say what he wants to. He is often appointed as the teacher's help and takes pride in playing his role diligently.

leet's journey of transformation has been neither easy nor is it complete. But with our belief of 'enabling every child to live up to his/her potential' in our schools, we continue to nurture and care for 1000+ children like Jeet, making space for their personal story, and giving them an excellent holistic education, and helping them overcome their near-impossible personal backgrounds.
