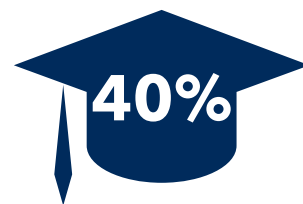
2018'S DATA CONTINUES TO SAY INCREDIBLE THINGS ABOUT YOU!

YOU'VE ALLOWED US TO ASSIST 56 SINGLE PARENTS YTD, AND 30 GRADUATES HAVE INCREASED THEIR INCOME ON AVERAGE FROM **\$21,333** TO AN AVERAGE \$43,722. THAT IS MAJOR FOR THESE GRADUATES!

Based on the 57% of graduates who responded to our survey in March of 2019, your impact over a nine-year period looks like this:

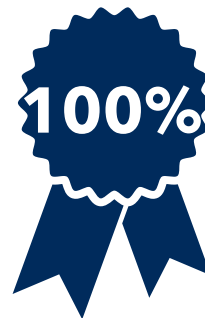
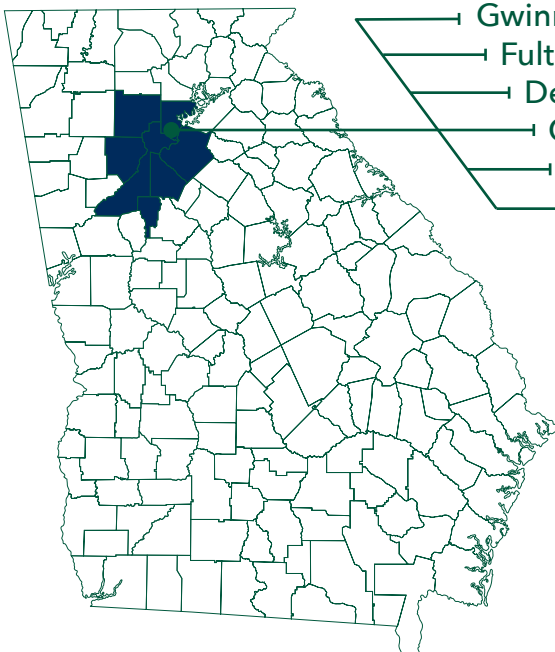

We were even more impressed with which counties you impacted low-income single parents in college the most, as of May 2018.

What's even better, they went from being unable to save, **to 80% of them saving an average of \$1,057!**

When they started the program, 70% of the graduate's credit ratings on average was 560, but now their scores on average is 611 or greater, a **51-point average score change.**

OVERALL IMPACT

Not only have you changed the outcome of 56 families, but you have ***inspired 107 children!*** You are changing generations!

Our **MISSION** is to empower, encourage, and equip low-income single parents to obtain a college degree, develop essential life skills, and ultimately become self-sufficient. We do this by providing our single parent students with:

1. Financial Assistance for housing and childcare
2. A facilitator to connect our students to community resources
3. Financial Literacy and a game plan for financial independence
4. Counseling resources and success coaching

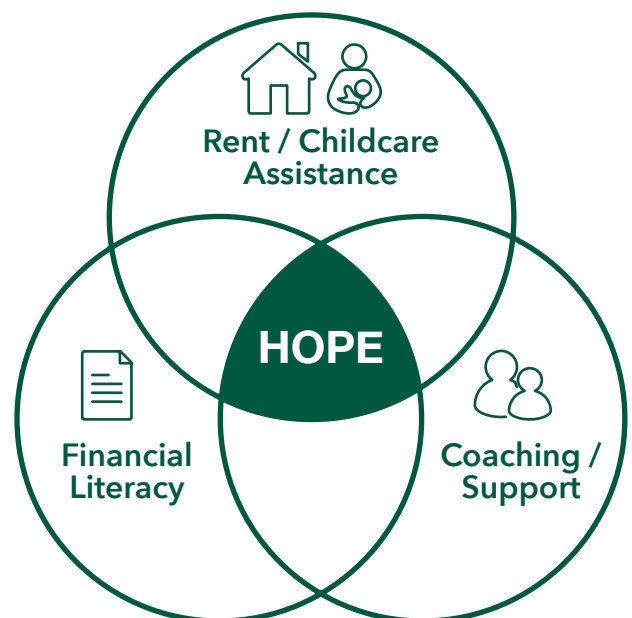
Our **VISION** is to see our single parents and their families break the cycle of poverty and become hopeful and self-sufficient, and increase their contribution to society.

PROGRAM IMPACT

This year, you've changed the lives of **20 single-parent families**, and **37 children**, 33% of which are first-generation college attendees in their families.

100% of our participants had an income 250% below poverty level, with an average income of \$18,226.

18% attend school in Gwinnett County.

Academics

With an average of a year in the program, our current participants have shown great growth. 100% of our program participants are on track to graduate on time. In less than six year's time, as our goals encourage.

73%

pursuing an associate's degree, while 27% are obtaining a bachelor's degree

Savings and financial stability

Before starting our program, 73% of our participants did not have a savings account. **NOW, 82% OF THEM DO, WITH 18% OVER \$500.**

27% of our participants own a home already.

82%

credit scores increased by an average of 65 points, and 27% increased by **100 points**

We had **three parents graduate** from college. One increased her income by **\$28,000**, and all were offered job opportunities in their career field. We expect to see eight more graduates in 2019, and we're very excited to see how things will change in their lives.

Resources from our partners

Habitat for Humanity Atlanta showed up in a big way for our participants with it's My Money, My Future program. The program was designed to help our participants get prepared for home ownership with a step-by-step process that includes financial education, one-on-one counseling with certified housing counselors, and it also allowed our participants the opportunity to receive \$300 if they completed the program and maintained a bank balance of \$200.

Gwinnett Chapter of the Georgia Association of Women Lawyers (GAWL) partners with our organization and provided 15 chef prepared turkeys with sides to complete an awesome dinner for the Thanksgiving Holiday. This was a great gift to our families, and they truly appreciated it! **THANK YOU SO MUCH SHARMIN & THE WOMEN OF GAWL!**



Rainbow Village, thank you for always allowing us to use your great Community Center and facilities for meetings and workshops! Thank you, **Perimeter Church** for your awesome help. Because of you, we have been able to supply **105 book bags full of supplies** to students in elementary, middle school and high school over the last 3 years!



Our corporate partners, **Market Source**, show up for us every year for the past three years! This year they helped us by providing a grant to cover expenses for two of our families, and they supported those families during the holiday season. **WE APPRECIATE YOU SO MUCH!**

AMANDA'S STORY

My name is Amanda, I moved to Georgia from Rhode Island with my daughter and husband in April 2013.

Things quickly deteriorated, and I found myself in a very mentally abusive relationship with two small children, and a husband who had a serious addiction to narcotics. I was able to leave the relationship after a year and a half of being in Georgia. I found a job that was so supportive and sensitive to my situation that one of the owners let me move into one of her properties. Even with working 50+ hours a week, I was still 3 months behind in rent, and I was living paycheck to paycheck, always trying to just keep the utilities on. There was even one month I had to go without power (I rented a generator). I decided that the only way I would be able to make ends meet is if I had a degree.



I started at the University of Phoenix Online University in September 2016 but this took more time away from work and even more time away from my kids. This is when I found H.O.P.E. I was looking for rental assistance on the United Way 211 website, and I decided to apply in December 2017 and was accepted into the H.O.P.E. Program in May of 2018. Thanks to Ms. Kenita and the services provided by H.O.P.E., I was able to keep paying for my son's childcare so I could go to work as my childcare assistance ran out in November of 2017. I was also able to get caught up with my rent and stay current ever since.

The benefits have been endless, and it is not just financial gains. The financial assistance has taken so much stress off of me that I am happier person and so are my kids. I am able to spend quality time with my kids now. Although my schedule remains extremely busy. I do not have to work every free minute I have and it also allows me to be able to budget my finances better.
