#### Dear Friends,

This year has ebbed and flowed, with many challenges and some amazing highlights. Our house parents Ethan and Roxie, moved to Johannesburg, due to Ethan finding employment there. However, they did not leave empty handed but with a set of twins, who they adopted. A momentous event took place in April when a set of siblings were repatriated to Nigeria to live with their biological family.

We welcomed new house parents Cyril and Sizakele into the iThemba Lethu family later in the year. Our HIV Prevention Programme continues in the community of Cato Manor, working in 7 schools, across 10 grades, reaching over 2300 students. This takes place in class, weekly youth clubs, holiday clubs and satellite activities i.e. hockey, soccer, cricket, girls clubs and sailing. Our partnership with Sail Africa has proved to be a game changer for Sifundo, a Mayville Secondary student on the Learn to Sail programme. He has been awarded a scholarship to attend Lawhill Maritime School in 2019 for grade 10 - 12. He joined Owami from Wiggins Secondary who just completed her first year and is excelling. We hope that we will be able to expand our work to more grades and all the schools in Cato Manor in the near future.

The sudden passing of our Youth Team Leader, Zama Gumede, came as a shock to us all and left us devastated. Zama, a mother of four, was a wonderful, caring leader and is sorely missed. The impact of our programmes is directly related to the people who work with our beneficiaries and so a big thank you to all our staff without whom this work would not be possible. We are most grateful to all our partners. There is power in partnership!

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


This was the 10th 5 year cycle of HIV Prevention Programme from Grade 5 - 9 with pre-adolescent youth since 2001.


#### 10 LIVES CHANGED:
