Partners for Rural Health in the Dominican Republic was established in 1995 by the University of Southern Maine, College of Nursing and Health Professionals. Since our inception, we have grown to include students from many Univ. of Maine campuses, Husson University, University of New England, and others.

Twice a year, students, faculty, medical professionals, interpreters, and other volunteers travel to the Dominican Republic to provide primary care, treat chronic illnesses, distribute first aid supplies, and offer health education to approximately 1,500 people annually in 20 different villages.
