**OBJECTIVES**

- Advance Adolescent girls and women's rights and improve girls' accessibility to Sexual and Reproductive Health Items and related services.
- Promote girls' education and help them stay in schools.

**PROGRAMS**

Leap Girl Africa's programs are developing the next generation of female leaders, advancing women's rights and providing them with the necessary resources, education and skills they need to grow in their career path which gives them a voice in their communities. One of the main tools that we use is advocacy, it permits us create an environment that is supportive for social change and equality.

**IMPACT**

Leap Girl Africa has successfully reached over 7000 people through its campaigns and on social media.

Leap Girl Africa Network called the GBVfreecommunity has 540 members in 13 countries in sub-Saharan Africa and 20 other African countries. She has helped a total of over 300 girls and women, both victims and non-victims of GBV get a sustainable livelihood in which they are feeding and sending their children to school and training other girls with the skills they acquired from Leap Girl Africa's programs.
