The Education programme offers interventions in Early Childhood Education, Remedial Education, and Digital Learning in low-income communities across India.

Our Early Learning Centre is designed for school readiness in young children and preventing late school enrolments. Through Disha Education Centre, we stop children from dropping out of school by strengthening their fundamentals in subjects like Hindi, English, and Maths, thus significantly improving their chances of being able to complete their basic education.

The Digital Learning Hub curriculum is designed to make children future ready by giving them an opportunity to learn Basic to Advanced level computers at a subsidised cost. The key objective of the Education Programme is to support children in achieving basic educational milestones, and to enable them to become future ready.

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Centered on our 'No School - No Football' policy, the FOOTBALL PROGRAMME reaches out to only those children who are committed to completing formal education.

The Programme delivers structured sessions using football oriented games designed to teach children essential life skills such as leadership, team work, communication, managing conflict, positive thinking, importance of education, etc., in addition to pertinent social issues such as gender equality, child marriage, child labour, addiction, hygiene, and environment as outlined by the World Health Organization.

The Football Programme uses an evolving curriculum designed by OSCAR's coaches and Young Leaders that is tailored to address the challenges faced by children in different low-income communities across India. OSCAR also delivers the Football Programme in partnership with other non-profit organisations and schools.



Rekha (21) is a teacher at OSCAR's Early Learning Centre, and currently pursuing TYBCom from Siddharth College (Mumbai). She aspires to become a professional teacher.

"In spite of the challenges that I faced, I continued my studies. And the support that I got from OSCAR was tremendous. Today, I am the only girl in my family who has completed her education. I have proved my parents wrong. I have shown them that I am nowhere less than a boy."



86% OF CHILDREN PURSUE HIGHER EDUCATION YOUNG LEADERS PROGRAMME offers a residential leadership training to youth from low-income communities that showcase leadership potential.

The training focuses on professional development of the participants and trains them in delivering 'Football for Development' sessions to children across different age groups.

More than 566 youths from states like Maharashtra, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Orissa, Bihar, and Goa have received leadership training under this programme – designed to advance Young Leaders in their professional aspirations and enables them to become role models in their community.

We believe in creating a platform for boys and girls to play football equally. Irrespective of gender. caste, religion, or any other social background, at oscar, we come together to celebrate the power of football for good.
