Victory Foundation Programme was founded in 2006 by a group of youths under the Mentorship of Rev. Michael Ouko and Rev. Joel Odalo and registered as an NGO in June 26th, 2008 in Kenya. The organization is managed with a Management Committee comprised of {(The Chairman, Programs Director-Secretary, Treasurer, Accountant, Resource Mobilization and Fundraising Director, Programs Manager)}. Currently we support Orphans Vulnerable Children, Street Children and Families, Widows and Girls affected by early pregnancies, besides counseling and empowering them to recollect their lives so as to have a future. VFP endeavor to provide safer homes for the teenage girls and their babies. They are taught that the depending on God is the only way out.

Problem Analysis:

As you might be aware or have heard, the informal settlements (slum) in Kenya are plagued with lack of clean water, poor drainage, poor sanitation, HIV/AIDS and pangs of poverty, drug abuse led by unlicensed /illicit alcoholic beverages, hence all nature of violence against humanity mostly male gender and we must therefore campaign against and make sure it is under control. We however will extend the same to other parts of the country through joint collaboration with other stakeholders.

Achievement:

Networking with other organizations like Global giving, feeding of 500 street children, 30 local schools with a combined population

of 10,110 and training of informal school directors on institutional management, fundraising and planning, Talent and talent day for the 300 children from 20 groups and schools. This has helped some children to rediscover themselves thus restoring hope to the destitute children in the society.
