We have attached images from our recent work in local Girls' Schools, specifically teaching on COVID 19 and general health. As you will see, we created a Training/Information Handbook. In addition, and still as part of this Proposal, we have attached videos of some of the work that we have been doing in this respect. We based our Training on information and resources from the World Health Organisation (WHO), for accuracy and authenticity.

Our most recent Outreach, which was directly in response to COVID 19 Global Pandemic, was a 4-Day Programme, which Uju Girl Child Foundation funded from our limited resources. We aim to do more similar Programmes, covering a longer duration and encompassing a wider group of schools and also, communities, especially the poor and hard to reach communities. We distributed Hand Sanitizers and gave practical demonstrations on Effective Hand Washing, as recommended by the World Health Organisation (WHO), as well as Buckets with fitted taps, which we also donated.

WHAT DID THIS PROGRAMME COST?

This particular Programme cost a total of \$1,023.32 (Dollars)/398,762.47 Naira (including Volunteers, Transportation, Photography/Video, Sound, Printing and Sundry Expenses).
