Project reach..

The Women league will be played in two zones, zone A and Zone B, each zone with 8 teams. Zone A is comprised of teams from Nairobi, Central and Eastern regions and Zone B comprises of teams from Western, Nyanza and Rift valley regions.

The numbers

The project targets to reach 384 players directly and each player also will be required to reach 10 others from their community, so the total reach will be 3840.

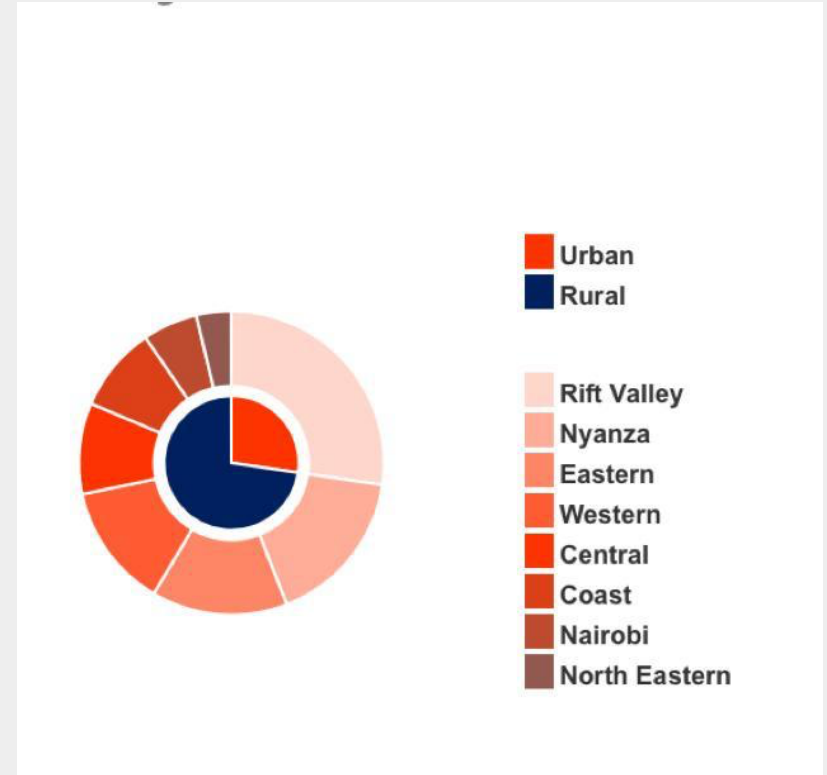
Zone B

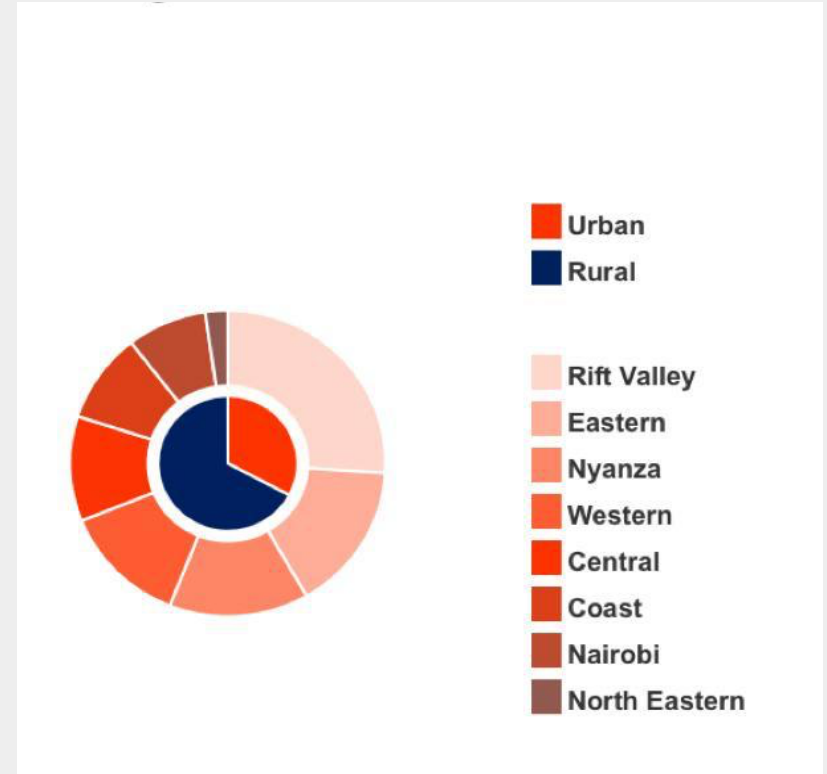
Demographics

- Youth secondary school enrollment 50% boys, 47% girls

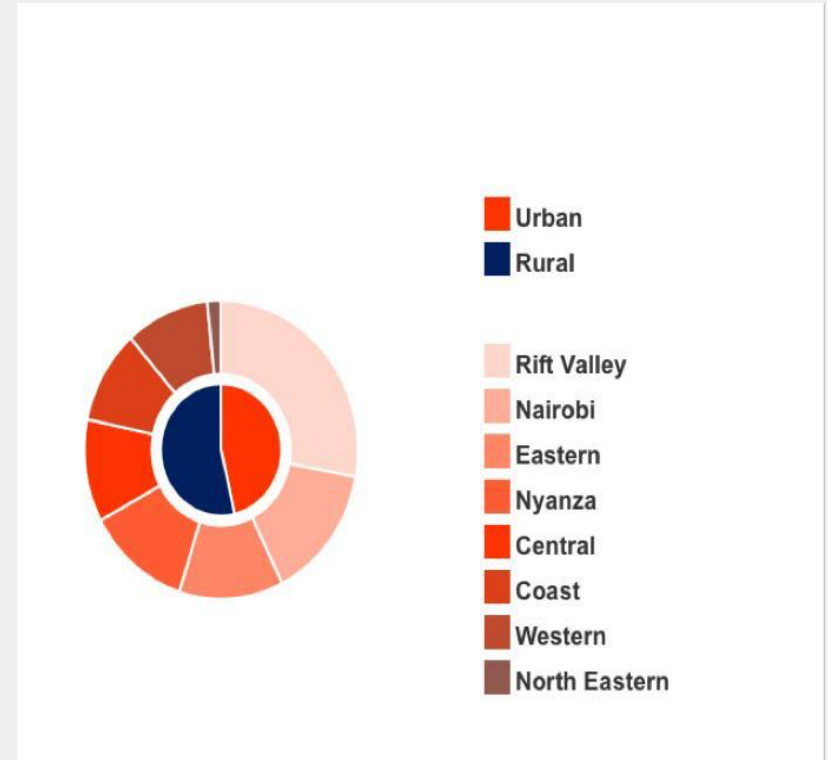
Female population aged 10-14 years
