Frequently Asked Questions

How and why was barbudanGO formed?

In 2017 Barbuda experienced Hurricane Irma the worst natural disaster to ever hit the island. barbudanGO was formed a year later in 2018 to mitigate future disasters through the strengthening of civil society to better service the community.

What is barbudanGO's mission?

Our mission is to give opportunity to sustain the pillars of community - education, preservation, preparedness, history and culture.

What is barbudanGO's vision for itself?

Our vision is to energise communities to be progressive, adaptive, resilient and vibrant.

What makes barbudanGO different?

barbudanGO is one of the first barbudan led NGO's on the island with Directors who reside in the community. We are a grassroots organisation that serves as a primary vehicle for popular participation in social and economic development.

Who will barbudanGO support?

barbudango will support unregistered groups/informal organisations, young people, vulnerable community members and local authorities.

What type of activities will barbudanGO support?

barbudanGO will support activities that contribute to the long term sustainable development of local communities through the areas of alternative education, disaster preparedness, preservation of the environment and restoration and documentation of history and activation of culture.

Who is on barbudanGO board?

There are currently three directors on the board who have a variety of skills in the areas of leadership in education, business management and history.
