PROJECTS AND INIATIVES

Hope SA Foundation provides social development services, missionary work, humanitarian aid and disaster relief efforts both nationally and internationally. We are committed to promoting sustainable and participatory development through various initiatives.

- Sustainable Food Program: Aims to alleviate hunger by serving a minimum of 400 hot meals a day to
  children and unemployed households in impoverished areas across South Africa. In addition to our
  daily food drives, we distribute food hampers to sustain a family for up to a month.
- Access to Clean Water: We provide water tanks, filtration systems and clean drinking water in communities.
- "Safer Women" Drive: Workshops and education on the importance of ending gender-based violence (GBV) The Safer Women drive equips and empowers people to speak out against GBV and take steps to protect themselves. We provide more than 2000 safety kits to shelters and communities we have adopted. Our short-term goal is to open a Hope SA Shelter with skills development.
- Disaster Relief Efforts: We work closely with the Department of Social Development. Our recent work includes the floods in KZN and Johannesburg, 2021 July unrest in KwaZulu-Natal, the Boksburg Tanker Explosion, Turkey and Syria Earthquake 2023 and informal settlement fires in KZN and Johannesburg. Hope SA provides emergency relief to support rescue and evacuation efforts, distribute essential supplies, food, water, clothing, mattresses, blankets set up temporary shelters for displaced individuals, provide medical supplies and psychological support to affected communities and support long-term recovery efforts such as rebuilding infrastructure and livelihoods. We continue our work closely with affected areas for months after the disasters.
- Other Initiatives: Back to School Drive, Winter Warmth Drive, Mandela Day, Mobile Health Care Unit,
   Christmas Hope Drive and Paws4Hope which supports community-led animal shelters.
- Hope SA Foundation supports other NGOs and community-led organizations as we recognize the importance of collaboration to promote sustainability and make a lasting impact.



### **IMPACT**



# Hope SA Foundation has positively impacted the lives of individuals, families, communities and businesses.

### National impact:

- 750 000 hot meals served since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic
- 20 000 food hampers distributed to households
- 100 000 food hampers during the Covid-19 pandemic and the July 2021 unrest
- Over 1000 children are supported with basic school requirements and uniforms within our Back to School Drives
- Over 3000 people are assisted within our Winter Warmth Drive with blankets and warm clothes
- Christmas Drive which provides over 2000 kids with Christmas gift hampers
- Safer Women Drive supports our GBV initiatives where educational workshops and material is provided with over 10 000 care packs with sanitary pads being distributed to shelters and communities
- Disaster relief of the KZN Floods 2022: 150 000 liters of water were distributed amongst other essential items such as clothing, baby supplies, blankets, mattresses, 20 tonnes of food and water tanks
- Disaster relief efforts with the Boksburg tanker explosion disaster. We have been directly assisting
  families with one on one support, food aid, essentials, repairs to damaged homes, financial support for
  children left without parents for school and living expenses

#### **International impact:**

 Our team flew into Turkey on the 7th of February 2023 for relief efforts towards the Turkey and Syria earthquake. Basic necessities of tents, sleeping bags, food and baby supplies were sent from South Africa via Turkish Airlines to support relief efforts.



Our projects are needs based and are vast which run throughout the year. We are on the ground daily and know that the huge economic gap, disasters and unemployment in our country has massive consequences in our communities.

- Winter Warmth Drive Blankets, warm clothes and food items are distributed to the homeless and elderly
- Daily hot meals in Boksburg, Eldorado Park, Fietas, Soweto, Rondebult, a rehab centre in Midrand, Tembisa, Florida, South Hills and we provide support to our community kitchens in Pietermaritzburg and Durban for KZN feeding
- We support three orphanages and two old age homes and we aim to increase this number to six orphanages and four old age homes by the end of 2023
- Water Supply Solutions We supply clean bottled water and water storage tanks. We also advocate against pollution and the misuse of water
- Paws for Hope Focuses on the care and welfare of animals and pets, supporting shelters with food and medical supplies
- Hope Mobi Clinic Medical checks, counselling and distribution of sanitary products to underprivileged areas. The project is expected to expand to other provinces in 2024/2025
- Hope SA Shelters To include training and skills development programs such as IT training, ECD, sewing academy and hydroponic gardens. The project is expected to be completed in 2023
- Hope Dignity Project To provide free sanitary products to scholars in Africa by 2024
- A drug rehabilitation center in 2024
- As part of international relief efforts we plan to expand our offices internationally by 2024/2025
