



USA for IOM's twofold mission— raising awareness on global priorities and spurring action and investment for migration initiatives and IOM's global operations by fostering partnerships with academia, philanthropy, the private sector, and the American people — has advanced unprecedentedly thanks to the commitment and support from USA for IOM's constituency in the United States.

As IOM's principal partner for private sector engagement and fundraising in the United States, USA for IOM is encouraged by and committed to strengthening and expanding these vital partnerships.

The current crisis unfolding in Ukraine is exacerbating existing humanitarian needs and creating new needs both inside the country and throughout the region. IOM's Flash Appeal for Ukraine and Neighbouring Countries seeks to mobilize USD 350 million in order to meet the needs of crisis-affected people inside Ukraine and its neighboring countries.

This flash appeal outlines IOM's proposed response over the next six months (March-August 2022), focusing on a range of activities that aim to meet the varied needs of those impacted by the crisis and is fully aligned with inter-agency appeals launched in response to the crisis.

## Areas of Response within the appeal will include:

- Water, Sanitation and Hygiene
- Protection
- Health
- Multipurpose Cash Assistance
- Food Security and Livelihoods
- Site Management Support
- Displacement Tracking
- Humanitarian Border Management

# Funding Requirements

**\$350M**

IOM funding requirements cover Ukraine, as well as its neighboring countries, including Poland, Moldova, Romania, Hungary, Slovakia, and additional countries impacted by the crisis. Funding will also support regional activities, in particular, the coordination of activities regarding data collection, analysis, and response to cross-border mobility flows and the coordination of assistance to third-country nationals.

Funding requirements for IOM Ukraine are for three months (March-May 2022), in line with the Inter-Agency Flash Appeal launched on 1 March 2022. Funding requirements after those three months will be assessed based on needs identified and the evolving situation in the country. In the case of neighboring countries, activities and funding requirements are based on the needs and projected planning figures as of 25 February, in coordination with respective national authorities, partners, and UNHCR.

Funding requirements for those countries will be reassessed alongside the revision of the Refugee Response Plan in mid-March.

Through this plan, IOM aims to reach internally displaced persons, refugees, third-country nationals (TCNs), and other types of migrants, as well as host communities affected by the crisis in Ukraine.

The planning targets used for this appeal are estimates based on currently available data on displacement and cross-border movement, as well as projections made through preparedness planning. Due to the ongoing nature and complexity of the crisis, IOM will continue to collect and analyze data on mobility dynamics and may adjust its targets as the situation evolves and more information becomes available.
