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Executive Summary

Send Them Back To School Project is a project initiated by <u>Friends Peace House</u> (FPH). FPH is a faith-based organization, registered NGO that was founded by the Evangelical Friends Church of Rwanda in December 2000. The mission of FPH is to promote peace, unity, and reconciliation among Rwandans and to holistically contribute to the development of the Rwandan society. FPH's vision is to see Rwandese people living together in good relationship with one another in healthy and well-developed communities.

Peaceful co-existence and development are very important to FPH as they involve everyone in effective and equal participation in problem solving and solution implementation. That is why FPH works closely with local communities, districts, the churches, governments and other developmental bodies to facilitate access to education and transfer knowledge to the young generation not fortunate enough to afford going to school. FPH has held successful meetings with the Districts in order to forge an understanding of children in need of access to education and foster community ownership in the project.

Project Overview

FPH has been supporting children and young adults from vulnerable families by admitting them at Mwana Nshuti Vocational Training Center. The Send Them Back To School Project was created to expand these efforts. For the Send Them Back To School Project, FPH would like to mobilize resources to assist vulnerable children in attending primary school and secondary school. As well as assisting underprivileged young adults wanting to attend vocational training and university. FPH actively evaluates children who are in need of assistance by working with local schools and the community. Children's situations are evaluated annually, allowing children to graduate from the program if they no longer need support. FPH believes that this foundational educational assistance will provide these children with the skills and knowledge they need to pursue better opportunities in the future.

This project is intended to complement the Government's efforts in achieving the Fourth Sustainable Development Goal, which is providing quality education by ensuring inclusiveness and equity in education and promoting lifelong learning opportunities for all.

The project's initial goal for 2023 is to help cover tuition fees and purchase school supplies for at least 40 primary and secondary school children. As well as help cover the cost of supplies and laptops for 5 underprivileged young adults that are attending university. Beginning in 2024, FPH would like to expand the program to help additional underprivileged children and young adults attend school.

The project's main aim is to create community capacity by creating more educational opportunities and facilitating access to education to vulnerable children in the Kicukiro, Kigali community.
