■ WHAT CHALLENGES ARE YOU ADDRESSING?

• Access to education in these areas is limited (a) because it is often locally unavailable, (b) because of domestic and economic pressures forcing children to work, (c) because Government schools are far and lacks proper facilities, and (d) because it has traditionally not been accorded value. Nearly half of rural children in our area are out of school, and literacy levels are around just 43%.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT:

Over all financial activities of this organization will be governed by specific organizational financial management system. Financial Management team of **DDEF** well organized.

Regular participation of the general members is a great source of inspiration of the management team of **DDEF**. Accountability of the Organization management to its members is positively controlling the behavior, attitude and role of the members of the management team. The Financial management of the organization is very much systematic and transparent. So, that any difficulties or problem of this organization could easily be removed or solved without hampering the activities or objectives. • The Executive Committee would also be done through quarterly meeting and regularly verifies all organizational activity expenses.

- The Executive Committee is the responsible tire for implementation of activity and finance of the organizational decisions taken by the general members.
- The member secretary / Chief Executive ,on behalf of the executive committee takes over all responsibility of executing the decisions of EC and the General Body.
- The staff members and senior staffs provide their every support to the chief executive and perform their activities with full responsibility

PROCUREMENT MANAGEMENT:

The procurement of goods or services will require complete recording and the expenses must be substantiated by proper documentation. Note that expenditure may not be accepted to the management or donor for procurement if those are not budgeted, allowable and reasonable. A procurement procedure must be followed. In case of extreme emergency which prevents to follow the procedure, prior permission must be sorted from the management. Administrative negligence or delays caused by poor management cannot be invoked to skip the normal procedure. The procedures to be followed for procurement of supplies are

Approval Committee: A list of approval authorities for procurement along with their approval limit should be kept prior to procurement. The Executive Director /Executive Committee of the organization must approve this list.

Procurement committee: The organization should form a procurement committee consisting of at least 2/3 members. The Executive Director and the accountant should not be included in this procurement committee. The Procurement committee will send their recommendations to ED or his/her designated person will finally approved but ED will remain accountable for all procurement.

Reporting System

DDEF Follow a regular and systematic reporting process using different monitoring and format Accounts coordinator collect data and prepared quarterly, half yearly and annual report of the organization. Chief executive /Director verify all information of the reports and presents in the EC meetings and General meetings regularly. Every donor give their prescribe financial format for monthly, quarterly and yearly report. **DDEF** follow all of those format for financial reporting. **DDEF** also prepared trail balance, R&P, income expenditure report and balance sheet every year for face internal, External and Donor Audit. **DDEF** s have no extra computerized Accounting system but they prepared all of report in computer donor prescribe format.

Audit System:

DDEF recruitment of Audit system was very transparent. The project accounts of the organization shall be audited at the end of project or yearly or as to be suggested by concerned donor/funding organization. Introduction

Disable Development and Educational Foundation (DDEF) was established on 1st January 2001 with an effort to spread the light of socio-economic development to all levels of society and to create a self-reliant and well-educated society for the development of disabled people. It is a socio-structural non-political voluntary organization

DDEF has been working mainly for the purpose of special education, training of youth and disabled persons, advanced training of farmers, fair use of local resources, social and economic development and creation of employment opportunities.

The organization is in different regions of the country such as; 4000 poor cleft palates and cleft palates completed free surgery operation program in Barguna, Barisal, Patuakhali, Pirojpur, Dhaka, Sirajganj and Jamalpur districts. The American donor organization has completed one with the cooperation of Smile Train. Also, various domestic donor organizations have been cooperating in this work since 2010.

Since 2008, unpaid special education programs are being conducted for children with disabilities from poor families in the village. Various donor organizations are assisting in this work. Currently 54 differently abled children are getting education in Raihanpur Disabled School run by DDEF.

One time grant is being provided to poor women. About 750 poor women have benefited from this program. Since the establishment of DDEF, around 800 wheelchairs, 200 walking sticks, 250 sewing machines and 25 crutches have been distributed free of cost to all the upazilas of the district, including Patharghata, Bamana and Betagi upazilas of the district. The organization has always been working with the local administration and public representatives for the development of the area. DDEF works for the development of the Rohingya community and any calamity crisis, including natural cyclones in the

Mother and Child Pusti, Cancer Oliver has been conducting direct donation and field specific advocacy activities in collaboration with various donor organizations for various patients including Cirrhosis. Every year, DDEF distributes food items and sarees to families with special needs including poor disabled families, widows and widows in the area to celebrate Eid. In the same way, during sacrifices, DDEF distributes among the poor people through sacrifice of cows and goats. Above all, the organization has been working relentlessly for 22 years for the social and economic development of Barguna district as well as the severely disabled people and the poor and widowed women in Barguna district in cooperation with the colleagues of DDEF, local public representatives, local administration and local foreign donors.

Schools program for disabled children run by DDEF:

DDEF has been running a fully unpaid school program for disabled students in Raihanpur of Patharghata Upazila.

52 children with different types of disabilities are getting education. The school is known as Raihanpur Disabled School. Number of teachers and staff of Raihanpur school is 9 people. The amount of own land is 7.50 percent.



Free sewing machine distribution and training among poor young women:

DDEF is distributing free sewing machines among poor unemployed youth women/disabled women in villages. 247 sewing machines have been distributed in the past year.





Free surgical operation for cleft palate:

Another one of DDEF's programs is free lip and cleft lip and palate surgery operations for poor disabled people. Through DDEF, with the financial and technical support of domestic and foreign donors, 4000 poor disabled persons have been given free surgery till December 2018.

Providing financial assistance: DDEF has been providing one-time financial support to poor disabled people in collaboration with various donor agencies. About 1550 poor disabled persons and young women have benefited under this scheme.





Health care activities:

DDEF has been conducting advocacy activities with various donor organizations for the treatment of cancer liver cirrhosis patients in villages. So far 40 such patients have benefited under this programme.





Distribution of winter clothes: Winter clothes are distributed among the poor disabled people, farmers and unemployed young women widows of the village. 400 people with disabilities are enjoying this facility. This program is being conducted through various local and foreign donor agencies.



Rohingya full housing program:

DDEF has been working in Cox's Bazar district since 2017 to house Rohingyas from Myanmar. This program is being conducted with the financial support of domestic and foreign donor organizations. So far 500 Rohingya people have benefited from this project.

Participation in development fairs:

DDEF participates in all the programs of the government and this is the continuation of the participation in the 2018 development fair.



Ramadan Programme: Another one of the activities of DDEF is to distribute rice, sugar, semai dal and saree lungi to poor disabled persons and widow women and farmers every year during Ramadan. It benefits about 500 people every year.









Sacrifice Programme: Under DDEF, slaughtering of sacrificial cows is done to share the joy of sacrifice among the poor, disabled and needy in the village.

Maternal and Child Health Scheme: DDEF provides nutritional health services to poor mothers and children in villages with financial support from various donor agencies. 500 mothers and children have benefited under this program





Water and Sanitation Programme: DDEF has distributed shallow tubewells and semi-permeable sanitary toilets as part of the free health care program among poor households.
