Overview...

The Imago Foundation is a charity that operates in Malawi, with a focus on **education**, **permaculture and environment**. We aim to advance the quality and access of education at **grass-root level**, rather than provide support around an existing flawed system Thus, we offer holistic education that includes **theoretical and practical knowledge**, whilst utilising outside space. Simultaneously, we tackle the issues within **nutrition** and **environmental degradation** by shifting community mindset towards permaculture, as a means to nourish both the people and the land.

Where it all began...

I (Hanna) first went to Malawi as a volunteer in **2014** for 20 months where I taught in a small primary school to year 5 and 6 children.

During this time, although I absolutely loved it, I witnessed **extreme poverty** and the every day struggles that are often taken for granted; I realised how much of

an **opportunity education** is and how **vital agriculture** was for daily life. This, combined with the incredible experiences I'd had there, confirmed to me that this was what I wanted to do with my life; and from then on it became my mission.

Our mission to help...

Upon return to the UK in 2016, I (Hanna) met my now-husband, Martyn. After **multiple trips** back to Malawi, and **thorough analysis of various reports/studies**, we decided that together we needed **more hands-on experience** of the national education and charity sector. So, after saving for a few years, we bought a van, converted it to a motorhome, and shipped it to Malawi with the idea that we could **travel to various projects** whenever we needed. In fact, we managed to visit a total of **22 organisations** in a year, which encompassed:

- 10 Permaculture/sustainability sites
- 4 Technical Skills Colleges
- 12 Nurseries

- 17 Charities
- 9 primary schools, 1 that we helped establish
- 10 Educational wrap-around services

After all of these visits, research/analysis and on-the-ground experience, we determined the **3 main issues**:

- Land Use and Nutrition
- Curriculum and Teaching
- Management of Project

What the Foundation will do...

- Nursery: Children in Malawi currently do not start school until they're 7-years-old. The Imago Foundation's nursery will allow children to start at 3-years-old to make the most of their formative years and build strong foundations for primary school.
- Primary School: Classes of 100+ students copy day-by-day national lesson plans and memorise phrases for exams. The Foundation's primary school will deliver a tailored curriculum with a focus on exploration and theme learning.
- Permaculture and Environment Protection: The Foundation's gardens will enable pupils to plant and harvest crops, cook nutritious meals, and also ensure at least 1 meal per day for students. Waste management, tree planting and alternative fuel sources etc will also be incorporated.

What we've done already...

- •Given 15 jobs to the community 3 permanent and 12 temporary
- Met chiefs of multiple levels to discuss development
- Taught small-scale English and permaculture
- Worked with National Parks and village environment groups
- •Held discussions with Ministry of Education, Lands and Immigration
- Connected with Limbe Rotary Club

The next year...

- Borehole Ensure sanitation, provision of safe drinking water, and irrigation for crops
- Fence Prevent encroachment and secure the safety of pupils
- Nursery Give local children strong foundations ready for primary school
- Land care Continue to plant crops and trees, ready to harvest for the students
- Community projects Introduce alternative fuel sources, create compost from waste etc

Total - £47,400 (Borehole drilling, water tower, tank and connections; nursery building, equipment, toilets and staff; fence posts and sheets.
