


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Meet Our Founder

Ndungu Nyoro | Founder, Affecto Foundation

Ndungu Nyoro is an award-winning philanthropist, Founder and Executive Director of Affecto Foundation, commonly known as **Watoto Wasome Program**. The desire to have academically gifted students from underprivileged backgrounds access quality education in Kenya led him to register the foundation as a Charitable Non-Governmental Organization in 2018.

Through the #100 Bob Challenge (0.7 USD) run on Facebook, Ndungu has been able to sponsor 134 students through secondary education with an yearly budget of up to 15 million Kenya Shillings (approximately 99,000 USD). He has done this through the support of his followers on Facebook page who currently stand at 270 thousand.

Ndungu believes the virtue of altruism is alive in every individual and can be employed for social good. Of the 134 students who are beneficiaries of Watoto Wasome program, 30 are currently pursuing professional courses in institutions of higher learning across Kenya and 104 are in secondary schools.

Through social media, and especially Facebook, Ndungu has created a community of people who believe in philanthropy. He conducts fundraising activities whenever a needy case arises and at the beginning of school calendar. He uses the same social media platforms to advocate for education as a fundamental human right and to highlight challenges faced by the education sector in Kenya. The advocacy also involves calling on the government to address specific issues affecting students, schools, and parents in Kenya.

In 2022, President of the Republic of Kenya at the time, H.E Uhuru Kenyatta awarded Ndungu Nyoro with the Head of State Commendation, HSC for his contribution to a better society through education. He is also an awardee of Top 40 Under 40 in Kenya in 2021; Finalist Person of the Year 2021 by the Star Newspaper Kenya and was featured in The People's Daily Newspaper in April 2022. Furthermore, he was featured in the Parent's Magazine April 2022 edition.

Ndungu Nyoro is married and is a father to two lovely daughters. He is a Community Scholarship Selection Board (CSSB) member of The Wings To Fly scholarship program. This is an initiative of the Equity Group and Mastercard Foundation (MCF), that was established to support secondary education for top performing children from financially challenged backgrounds.

Ndungu has also been a consultant on local philanthropy at YETU INITIATIVE. YETU works with Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) to advance the principles of self-reliance and locally sustained development. The initiative is sponsored by Aga Khan Foundation and USAID. The visible transformation of the Watoto Wasome beneficiaries becomes the fuel that drives Ndungu to continue overcoming various obstacles to ensure that young people disadvantaged backgrounds access education. Ndungu passionately agrees with Nelson Mandela's saying that 'Education is greatest equalizer'.

He enjoys playing darts and spending time with his loved ones. Ndungu Nyoro has a career medical background and worked in the pharmaceutical industry for 13 years.

His favorite quote is from Mother Teresa, "I alone cannot change the world but I can cast a stone across the waters to create many ripples."

1.0 Executive Summary



Affecto Foundation is a Non-Profit Organization registered in Kenya on January 16th, 2018 to run charitable causes. The organization was founded by Ndungu Nyoro driven by his great passion to see academically gifted students from underprivileged backgrounds access quality education. Affecto Foundation believes in the power of philanthropy for social good.

Affecto Foundation mobilizes resources from the public, individuals, and corporate institutions of goodwill to sponsor bright learners from economically challenged and disadvantaged backgrounds to transition from primary education and remain in school until completion.

Affecto Foundation's vision is to create a future where opportunities are equal for all regardless of social class. The mission is to promote access to education, promote access to quality healthcare, and promote community development for the less privileged and provide a platform to exercise humanity. Affecto Foundation's thematic area of focus is Sustainable Development Goal number 4 (SDG4): Quality Education. This Annual Impact Report highlights the achievements of Affecto and provides evidence of its impact in 2022.

According to The Kenya Economic Survey Report (Kenya National Bureau of Statistics, 2022), it is estimated that 1.2 million learners sat for the 2021 KCPE examinations; however, only 75.8 % transitioned to form one. Poverty remains one of the greatest challenges faced by families trying to enroll their children in form one.

Watoto Wasome is the Affecto Foundation flagship program that supports students from disadvantaged backgrounds to access secondary education through provision of scholarships, and scholastic support such as books, uniforms, and transport to and from school.

The support is coupled with mentorship throughout the academic journey and economic strengthening of guardians of the Watoto Wasome scholars. The students are deliberately exposed to opportunities such as those presented by the Presidential Award program Kenya and participation in conferences and events.

In 2022, Affecto Foundation registered excellent outcomes. Under the Flagship Watoto Wasome program, Affecto Foundation provided 104 students (58% male and 42% female) with scholarships to access secondary education; of these, 80% consistently posted academic grades of C+ and above.

Additionally, of the 23 that completed Form four and sat for their Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education examinations, 91% qualified to join universities and 9% Technical, Industrial and Vocational Education Training (TIVET) colleges. In the same year, 46 new students were onboarded and started their secondary school journey.

A total of 134 students were mentored in various areas of interest in the year; 46 new and 88 ongoing Watoto Wasome beneficiaries.

Affecto Foundation is a Non-Profit Organization registered in Kenya on January 16th, 2018 to run charitable causes. The organization was founded by Ndungu Nyoro driven by his great passion to see academically gifted students from underprivileged backgrounds access quality education.



Specifically, 24 students who were about to complete their secondary school education were mentored in preparation for the transition to university and college education.

The topics dealt with included: public speaking, interviewing skills, job application, job shadowing, surviving campus life, sex and relationships, sexual reproductive health, and financial literacy & entrepreneurship. Professionals from different fields were involved to cover the topics.

On entrepreneurship, Affecto Foundation supported three families with seed capital to start income-generating activities to increase their household incomes. Affecto foundation also provided two Watoto Wasome program alumni with seed funds to start self-development initiatives and businesses.

In addition, the Affecto Stars alumni formed a Chama (association) that has since mobilized Ksh 12,850 in readiness to start their business.

In 2022, 12 high-value individuals and 9 corporates funded Affecto Foundation activities to the tune of Ksh 12,847,464. A large online community participates in online social media fundraising campaigns, contributing to meeting the Affecto Scholars' scholarships. Affecto Foundation's future plans include setting up an Endowment Fund of Ksh 20 million (USD 200,000) and establishing a school dubbed 'Affecto Leadership and Innovation Centre'.

Affecto Foundation plans to purchase 40 acres of land budgeted at a cost of 30 million (USD 300,000) and construct school facilities (classrooms, boarding facilities to cater for 400 students) at a cost of 200 million Kenya Shillings (USD 2 million)

Affecto Foundation work contributes to the achievement of nine out of the 17 SDGs. Among them, the critical SDGs include SDG 1- No Poverty, 4- Quality Education, 5- Gender Equality, and 3 - Good Health and Well-Being.

Watoto Wasome is the Affecto Foundation flagship program that supports students from disadvantaged backgrounds to access secondary education through provision of scholarships, and scholastic support such as books, uniforms, and transport to and from school.





2.0 Overview of Strategic Objectives and Activities

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Affecto Foundation is a Non-Profit Organization registered in Kenya on January 16th, 2018 to run charitable causes. Affecto Foundations' thematic area of focus is Sustainable Development Goal number 4 (SDG4): Quality Education.

We believe in strengthening the involvement of society at large in meeting the needs of those from marginalized and disadvantaged backgrounds; particularly young people to access quality education.

We mobilize resources from the public, individuals, and corporate institutions of goodwill to sponsor bright learners from economically challenged and disadvantaged backgrounds to transition from primary education and remain in school until completion. We believe that philanthropy is at the heart of each individual and can be tapped for society's good.

Therefore, we unashamedly tap into this sense of philanthropy through social media fundraising campaigns, corporate social responsibility, shared value initiatives, and fundraising events; all geared towards raising scholarship funds

for our Watoto Wasome program. We believe education is the most powerful weapon you can use to change the world.



To create a future where opportunities are equal for all regardless of social stratification.



To promote access to quality healthcare, education and community development to the less privileged and providing a platform to exercise humanity.

Strategic Objectives.

In 2022, we undertook various activities geared towards the achievement of the strategic objectives outlined below.



To provide opportunities for academically able children from under-privileged families and disadvantaged communities to access secondary school education through academic scholarships.

2.1 Watoto Wasome Activities

Under this objective, Affecto Foundation provided 104 students (58% male and 42% female) with scholarships to access secondary education; of these 23 sat for the KCSE examinations and all qualified to join institutions of higher education (91% University and 9% TVET) and 46 were newly on-boarded. This is linked to SDG 4 - Quality Education. Two Watoto Wasome beneficiaries were provided with professional counselling therapy enabling them to excel in their academic performance.

At Affecto Foundation, we believe mentorship is necessary to equip and transfer skills and influence the scholars' world view enabling them to take deliberate actions to realize their full potential. According to research by mentoring org (Mentor, 2023), it postulates that quality mentoring relationships have powerful positive

effects on young people in a variety of personal, academic, and professional situations. Ultimately, mentoring connects a young person to personal growth and development, and social and economic opportunities.

Therefore in 2022, Affecto Foundation provided mentorship to the Affecto Scholars (Watoto Wasome beneficiaries) during the three workshops held in 2022. These included the induction to Affecto Family held at Alliance Girls Secondary School reaching 46 cohort 6 students who had been selected to join the Watoto Wasome program in the year.

The workshops covered such topics as time management, self-branding, leadership, sex and relationships, and mental health.

At Affecto Foundation, we believe mentorship is necessary to equip and transfer skills and influence the scholars' world view enabling them to take deliberate actions to realize their full potential.

Secondly, 88 Affecto Scholars attended the April 2022 mentorship session held at KAG EAST University Buru Buru.

The scholars were mentored on the following areas:

• Life skills for successful school completion and responsible citizenship such as leadership and debating skills, drug awareness, community service, civic & governance engagement, time management, online safety, child protection and human rights, sex and relationships, negotiation skills, self-awareness and esteem, sexual and reproductive health, and financial literacy and entrepreneurship.

- Academic study practices and attitude.
- Career guidance and counselling and the study pathways.
- · Mental health.

Further, 24 students who had just completed their secondary school education were mentored to prepare them to transition to university and other institutions of higher learning during a session held 9th August 2022 at Affecto Office. They were mentored on public speaking, interview skills, job application, job shadowing, surviving campus life, sex and relationships, sexual reproductive health, and financial literacy & entrepreneurship.

Affecto Foundation supported two Watoto Wasome program alumni with seed fund to start self-development initiatives and businesses to earn income and meet their needs.

2.2 Economic Strengthening at Family Level Activities

Further, Affecto Foundation supported families of three sponsored students with Seed capital to start income generating activities to increase their household income. The aim of the initiative was to ensure the families are able to take care of other children to continue attending school. This is linked to SDG 1- No Poverty.

Affecto Foundation supported two Watoto Wasome program alumni with seed fund to start self-development initiatives and businesses to earn income and meet their needs. Additionally, the alumni formed a 'Chama'/ association aimed at mobilizing savings among the alumni for funding their investments. Affecto Foundation supported the association by providing registration fee and information and support to the members.

The 'Chama' has mobilized Ksh. 12,850 in their savings account. This activity is linked to SDG 10 - Reduced Inequalities - Economic growth. Additionally, Affecto Foundation provided shopping during the festive season to a family in Kiamumbi, Kiambu County. The grandmother who takes care of five grandchildren was glad to have been thought of and surprised with shopping. SDG 2 - Zero Hunger.

2.3 Affecto Foundation Operational Support Activities

Affecto Foundation has no permanent employees. In 2022, the foundation relied on volunteer Watoto Wasome Alumni who are attending university studies to provide part time services; they are given a stipend. In 2022, seven alumni volunteered at Affecto Foundation. This activity is linked to SDG 8 - Decent Work & Economic

Growth. In addition, five professional volunteers provided services to support the foundation's operations and programs.

2.4 President's Award Kenya Activities

Affecto Foundation is a licensed member of the President's Award Kenya. The Foundation has enrolled all Watoto Wasome Scholars into the Award Program. This has proven to be very resourceful in raising resilient young adults; who can overcome difficult situations.



This scheme also engages our learners in productive activities during their free time. Affecto Foundation facilitated 113 Scholars and alumni to participate in the president's Award activities. The President's Award Kenya, is a self-development program for young people countrywide that equips them with positive life skills to make a difference for themselves, their communities,

their country, and the world. The Award is a member of the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Association, which oversees the Award Program for young people in over one hundred and twenty countries. The award program is then divided into; Bronze, Silver, and Gold Level and achievement of each is based on achievement of certain skills and milestones.

3.0 Problem Statement



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To promote education as a fundamental human right, Affecto Foundation continued with engaging the online community on matters related to education and its management in the country.

The foundation was able to highlight challenges the education sector is facing and is calling on the government to address specific issues affecting students at specific institutions of learning.

According to The Kenya Economic Survey Report (Kenya National Bureau of Statistics, 2022), it is estimated that 1.2 million learners sat for the 2021 KCPE examinations. However, only 75.8 % transitioned to form one. This exposed 25.2% of the pupils to risks such as teenage pregnancy, early marriages, child labour, petty crimes, and bad lifestyle habits.

According to The Kenya Economic Survey Report (Kenya National Bureau of Statistics, 2022), it is estimated that 1.2 million learners sat for the 2021 KCPE examinations, however, only 75.8 % transitioned to form one.

Over the years, Kenya's education sector has improved leading to increased enrollment in primary education at the primary level reaching universal levels while secondary school enrolment increased by over 50% in the seven years before the pandemic.

These achievements have resulted directly in increased spending and enrolment at all levels, as well as consistent improvements in learning outcomes before the pandemic. The main challenges facing the education sector are: increasing enrollment in post-primary education, improving learning outcomes, and reducing deep inequalities. Enrollment at the primary level is almost universal but falls sharply when transitioning to secondary education.

Fourteen percent of the students who complete grade 8 of primary education do not enroll in form 1 of secondary and about 40 percent of students who begin grade 1 do not complete form 4 (grade 12).

Sharp drops observed in promotion rates between grades 7 and 8 and between forms 3 and 4 coincide with the national examinations, which determine progress from primary to secondary and from secondary to upper education levels (MoE, 2018). However, poverty remains a challenge that affect pupils' transition from primary to secondary school.

The cost of secondary school education in Kenya is largely met by the parents in the form of tuition and boarding fees among other costs. Therefore, net enrollment rates are significantly higher in pre-primary, primary, and secondary education, for children from households in the top 20% of the income distribution, when compared to the bottom 20% (The World Bank, 2022). In addition, education outcomes are much lower in rural areas and for lower-income populations.

Further, inadequate access to early childhood development education (ECDE) for children from disadvantaged households contributes to poor education and other outcomes later in life. There is immense evidence of the contribution of quality early childhood development education (ECDE) to brain development, future academic success, health outcomes, and overall national economic growth. World Bank asserts that early childhood experiences have a profound impact on brain development – affecting learning, health, behaviour, and ultimately, lifetime opportunities.

Yet, in low-income countries, just one-in-five children have access to pre-school. Therefore, lack of access to high-quality Early Childhood Development Education (ECDE) programs can negatively impact learning outcomes, and ultimately reduce opportunities for meaningful employment in adulthood. Despite the inadequate access to quality ECDE and resources, some students still perform well academically at the end of primary-level schooling.

Affecto supports such students from disadvantaged backgrounds to transition to secondary education through scholarships coupled with mentorship and deliberate exposure programs to grow and strengthen their life skills, confidence, academic engagement and leadership. The mentorship and exposure interventions address the deficiencies created during earlier years to ensure the wholesome growth and engagement of adolescents and adults.

5.0 Outcomes and Impact



5.1 Academic Performance

Affecto Foundation supported a cohort of 23 students in form 4, who sat for the Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education in 2022. Majority (91%) scored grade C+ and above and will be transitioning to universities while the rest (9%) will be joing TVETs.




Figure 3: Affecto Scholars 2022 KCSE Performance

In 2022, Affecto Foundation Sponsored 104 students in secondary school. Below is their academic performance per term. Over 80% of students consistently post grades C+ and above. The below 15% achieving less than grade C+ are being constantly supported during holidays to improve their academic performance. Of the 104 students sponsored under the Watoto Wasome program, majority (80%) consistently achieved C+ and above in their end of term examinations. Less than 15% achieved below C+ grade.

Affecto Stars 2022 Academic Performance




Figure 4: Affecto Scholars 2022 Academic Performance by Term



5.2 Mentorship

We attribute academic performance not only to providing scholarships but also mentorship. Below is a proxy to showcase the outcomes of mentorship on academic performance for the Affecto Scholars who sat for their KCSE in 2022.

5.3 Skills Development

- Leadership development. Affecto Foundation interviewed 22 out of the 53 alumni. Out of the 22 Affecto Alumni, 16(72%) were engaged as leaders in school, church and community. The 16 alumni mentioned that mentorships attended at Affecto equipped them with skills to engage as leaders and shaping their attitudes towards leadership in a positive manner. Of the 16 alumni 8 indicated they have ambitions to seek national leadership positions.
- Exposure to national and world youth fora and ecosystem. Two Affecto Alumni were exposed to international conferences in the year 2022. Evans Mutharimi represented Affecto in Tanzania International Model United Nations in Morogoro, Tanzania while Alice Gathe represented Affecto in The Global Youth Summit in Bangkok, Thailand. (See pages 34-44)
- President's Award program. In 2022, 113 Affecto Foundation Scholars and Alumni participated in The President's Award Kenya Activities. Of the 134 scholars and alumni, 104 achieved the bronze level and 30 achieved the silver level. Affecto Foundation facilitated their undertaking to be able to achieve all the set activities and skills. The Gold level activities will be started in year 2023 for those who have completed the silver level.

5.4 Affecto Foundation Alumni Saving Mobilization

In 2022, 18 members of Affecto Foundation Alumni started a savings and loaning group named Circumstantial Brothers and Sisters (CBS).

The group envisions creating an enabling environment for entrepreneurial mind through education, savings and exposure to the world of business by having investment projects aimed at improving the financial stability and sustainability of the members and non-members.

The members contribute ksh. 200 per month. Currently, they have saved Ksh 12,850. They also get a chance to broaden their knowledge on the most viable investments alongside an opportunity to exercise their careers by applying for jobs.




Figure 6: Presidential Award Affecto Scholars Achievements in 2022

5.5 Household Economic Strengthening for Parent/Guardians

Affecto Foundation supported 3 families to start income generating activities in 2022. We identified families that needed support to increase their incomes at household level. We interviewed the parents and identified the area of business they're interested in. Afterwards, we analyzed their ideas and after verification, we granted them seed capital. The guardians share weekly progress reports with Affecto Foundation.

The families were given critical skills in entrepreneurship and financial literacy. The families earn an average of ksh. 600 per day. They report they are able to meet the basic needs of their family including the cost of transport for their school going children.

Affecto Foundation supported 3 families to start income generating activities in 2022.

5.6 Resource Mobilization for Affecto Foundation

Affecto Foundation is funded by like-minded well-wishers who include individual donors, corporates and organizations. In 2022, 12 high value individuals and 9 corporates funded Affecto Foundation activities. A large online community participates in online social media fundraising campaigns which contributes to meeting the scholarships for the Affecto Scholars.

The social media online campaigns bring together Kenyans of all walks of life who contribute any amount they have. Some have contributed as low as Ksh 10 indicating that Kenyans have the right attitude and willingness to meet the needs of others who are disadvantaged.

In 2022, donations to Affecto Foundation totalled to Ksh 12,847,464; of which 90% were unrestricted funds.




Figure 7: Funds mobilized in 2022

5.0 Summary of Key Learnings




- Performance of students in KCPE does not define their performance in KCSE. Intervening by providing support in the 4 years of learning is critical to change the students' academic performance trajectory. Well fashioned and delivered mentorship coupled with needbased psycho social support and counselling does change the students' attitude and equip them with skills for better academic performance.
- Individuals in community love to identify with genuine philanthropy endeavors and will participate even when they are not very highly resourced individuals as long as they are meeting the needs of those disadvantaged in the society. There is transparency and integrity in running such endeavors and they are able to see what their resources are achieving. Individuals with little economic strength find satisfaction in contributing to the education of the less privileged Ksh 100 or less. Social programs can tap into community philanthropy to meet social needs.
- Life-skills are critical in building the confidence of Affecto Stars. This has led to improved academic performance and interpersonal relationships. This further translates to better relations among themselves and others and being able to engage in meaningful discussions with others.



- Mentorship is the game changer in secondary school students to equip them with critical life skills that change their life trajectory to successful personal development and meaningful engagement in society. The popularity of mentorship among the Affecto Stars led to it becoming demand driven enabling the scholars to articulate their mentorship needs. The Affecto Alumni provides need-based mentorship to scholars.
- Support to families of sponsored students has had great impact in giving the scholars the mental relief necessary for academic engagement at school. The scholars home environment affects their performance at school. Therefore, coupling sponsorship and family support compounds the benefit reaped from such endeavors.

Performance of students in KCPE does not define their performance in KCSE. Intervening support in the 4 years of learning is critical to change the students' academic performance trajectory.





7.0 Stakeholder Feedback



TESTIMONIAL BY A MOTHER

OF AN AFFECTO SCHOLAR.

On the slopes of Nyeri county, Affecto Foundation onboarded a student in 2021. The student is a cohort five beneficiary of Watoto Wasome program. He attends school at Nyeri High School. During school holidays the student lives with his grandmother because their mother lives in a single room that cannot accommodate him, the sibling and the mother.

The student at Nyeri High School is a disciplined and resilient young man who portrays great potential. He witnessed domestic violence leading to his parents' separation. In 2022, Affecto realized that he was having a hard time focusing on academics.

The mother hardly provided three meals in a day. For this reason, Affecto Foundation chose to intervene for the benefit of the household and the Affecto Star.

For this report, we interviewed the mother and below is what she had to say:

Before I began the business of selling charcoal and onions, I used to do casual jobs in construction sites and laundry in people's homesteads; there was no guarantee I would get a job on a daily basis.

I would at times get them only three times in a week and sometimes none at all. In construction sites, I would get paid ksh. 500 at most. Doing laundry in people's homesteads gave me a maximum of ksh. 250 a day. I could not save, and even when I tried, I would end up spending the amount on the days I didn't find a job.

When I began the business in 2022, with the help of Affecto Foundation, gradually I started noting some changes. I could make ksh. 800 on the good days and sometimes when the peak season was over, I made Ksh 500. This encouraged me to save ksh. 100 per day and accumulatively, I saved ksh. 8,000 and bought a goat.

With the same trend, I bought 10 iron sheets and construction wood. I am hoping to construct a house for my son so that he can move nearer to his sister and I.

I recall struggling to pay ksh 500 for my young girl's school fees. The burden was eased when I began this business. Even now that the fee has increased to ksh. 700, I am able to pay. I have to admit, it has not been easy.

However, I am glad we are not struggling to find food. Even now that we're not in the peak season, I am able to support my two children with basics.

I love seeing them happy and I hope to do more. All in all, may God bless Affecto for holding my hand.



9.0 Future Plans and Projections




Affecto Foundation short term future plans include setting up an Endowment Fund of Ksh 20 million (USD 200,000) to address sustainability of Affecto Foundation.

Affecto Foundation short term future plans include setting up an Endowment Fund of Ksh 20 million (USD 200,000) to address sustainability of Affecto Foundation. Further, Affecto foundation has plans to set up a school dubbed Affecto Leadership and Innovation Centre.

The school will be developed in three phases.

- Phase one entails purchasing 40 acres of land budgeted at a cost of 30 million (USD 300,000).
- Phase two entails construction of school facilities (classrooms, boarding facilities to cater for 400 students at any point in time,

- and the business modelling and incubation hub costed at 200 million Kenya Shillings (USD 2 million).
- Phase three entails investing in entrepreneurial initiatives for the school's sustainability. This will include building an auditorium for use by the school and that can be hired by others at a fee. In addition, Affecto will venture in turning the center in to a self-sustaining model by fixing and use of clean energy, establishing a farm to produce food for consumption by the school community and for sale and investing in an Affecto Village. The village is aimed at ensuring the center is surrounded by neighbours who become long term partners of the school.
