




Previous Growth




- Years 2017-2019 and 2022-2023 show proof that the program is successful
- During **COVID19** lockdowns, all women defaulted on loans (and are still slowly paying them back). We did not give out any new loans as the economy and population were suffering. We did not want our staff to suffer too, so we continued their salaries hence the further dip.
- We will reduce operating costs by 50%
 for 2024 to allow the money to grow
 faster than in previous years

Expected Growth After \$12,000 DonationDate of Self Sustaining: **December 2024**





Economic Empowerment

(Microfinance + Entrepreneurship)

Training: Financial literacy and basic business skill workshops

Accountability:

Members must apply in groups and hold each other accountable for repaying loans

Opportunity: The monetary access needed kickstart or build a business for those with little to no collateral

SUSTAINABLE GROWTH:

For individuals and for the organization: every loan is returned with 5% monthly interest, to allow us to cover operating costs and reach more women as the program grows, and allow women to feel responsible and accountable for the success of their own business

Education


(school for local children K-8

Literacy: for a globalized future. We provide literacy in English, because it is Uganda's official language and the most spoken worldwide, as well as in computer science and internet communication.

Technology: beyond basic computer courses, to advanced coding, music production, DJ courses, and film editing.

Creativity: is encouraged across the board, from new business ideas to new song ideas, to visual arts and painting.





EDUCATION PROGRAM

- 15% of education operating costs are met by local parents who are contributing towards their children's education
- The parents make in-kind donations of food or education supplies for the children if they cannot afford to pay cash

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

We have given loans and business
coaching to 1,500 women over the
last 6 years. The interest
compounded on these loans allows
us to cover the operating costs of the
loans program and eventually will
sustain the entire organization

Equality

Lead by example: our Ugandan team is staffed of majority women

Life Skills: leadership, accountability, teamwork

Prioritize marginalized groups

- Women: gender equality, anti-violence, and reproductive health workshops for people of <u>all</u> ages and genders to remove taboos and normalize healthy menstrual management and HIV protection
- Refugees: reproductive health, mental health, and microfinance coaching for South Sudanese refugees in the local area, to help integrate them with our community
- Mental Illness: focus on those who were child-soldiers and other post-war survivors: spreading awareness on mental health, PTSD management, mindfulness, meditation and other tools
