A street children project refers to an initiative aimed at addressing the issues facing children who live and work on the streets. Alkhidmat Foundation is currently running 63 Child Protection Centers. These projects typically involve various stakeholders, government including agencies, nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), and community-based organizations, working together to provide these children with essential services such as education, healthcare, and protection from abuse and exploitation.

The specific goals of street children projects can vary depending on the needs of the target population and the resources available

- To provide them with basic education and develop their morals.

The synoptic view of all this clarify that it has adverse effects upon these children, society and economy. These children are neglected by parents, family society and government.

To serve these street children Alkhidmat Foundation has initiated Child Protection Project. There are 63 Child Protection Centers in Pakistan having strength of 2817 street children whose getting free education as well as carrier counseling for their future along the character building so that they may become productive citizens. Keeping in view the large number of street children in all over the Pakistan, Alkhidmat Foundation has planned to open more centers for the street children in Pakistan.


Situation Analysis

Pakistan ranks 161 out of 192 on the Humanitarian Development Index (HDI: 2021-2022) The average Pakistani receives only 8 years of schooling, and the gross per capita national income is just over \$4,600. As of 2023, poverty is expected to reach 37.2 percent (\$3.65 /day 2017ppp). There is still a lack of formal government statistics and data on street children. Figures are are usually doctored to suit the needs of the country's political standing, as a result, it is difficult to map out the actual situation. Estimates suggest that there are 1.5 million street children in Pakistan - a number which is increasing rapidly due to displacement, migration, extreme poverty, and rising numbers of runaway children forced to leave their homes after experiencing violence in the household, workplace and educational institutions. Once on the streets, these children are at greater risk of being drawn into situations of abuse, such as child labour, exploitation, trafficking, and arbitrary arrest.

The rehabilitation of this growing number of children is becoming a difficult challenge for the government to handle. As per the Kids Rights Index 2022 Pakistan has been ranked 149th out of 185 countries.

They face safety and wellbeing risks, many of them work, often in hazardous and low-paid jobs to support themselves and their families. The boys are used to petty hefting, while the girls are often forced into prostitution

A particular challenge for Pakistan is to address the growing number of children living on the streets. The children are being denied their rights. The UN convention on the rights of the child recognizes that every child is entitled to a standard of living adequate for their physical, mental, spiritual, moral and social development. Children end up on the street for a variety of reasons; as a result of a family break-up (divorce or separation of parents), abandonment by their parents, running away from home due to domestic violence, family conflict or poverty. A common theme amongst street children is also the rural-urban migration that they, or their family, have undertaken to flee rural poverty in search of a better life in the city. On the streets, the children are homeless, ill-fed, ill-clothed and devoid of parental care. Though several acts and policies have been formulated to protect the children, the number of street children and their vulnerability is increasing, along with rapid urbanization across the country.













There are many reasons that children are living on the streets or they are spending the day on the streets and night at their homes. There may be domestic violence, economic or social disruption, and physical or psychological abuse which led them to the streets. Tragically their homelessness can lead to further exploitation. To protect and support them in their dreams Alkhidmat Foundation have established child protection centers, for that we required your financial support. Alkhidmat Foundation is not only providing them formal education but working on their Psychosocial development along with some refreshments on weekly basis, exposure visits and medical checkups on quarterly basis.

The specific objectives of the initiative are:

- Protecting vulnerable children from the indignity and risks associated with living on the streets.
- Providing children with an education, life skills and vocational training.
- Increasing family and community knowledge about child protection and safety.
- Enabling communication and coordination among service-providing organizations.

Alkhidmat Foundation has established 63 Child Protection centers for street children to bring normality in their life.

- Persuasion to Schools
- Psycho-Social Counseling

> Key Project Activities

Alkhidmat Foundation takes a holistic approach to helping children stand on their own two feet and to lead better lives. The approach addresses the short, medium and longer-term dimensions of the challenges faced by street and working children. The key activities of the project are:

- Alkhidmat Foundation provides direct services to street and working children to address their immediate safety, enrolling them in Child Protection center. Project staff identify vulnerable children, preparing a personalized profile of each child's individual needs. Immediate health care and counselling are provided.
- 2. The children are provided with an education, life skills and vocational training to enable them to live more productive lives. They participate in classes tailored to their own learning capability and requirements (for instance, some will have never been to school whilst others will be school drop-outs). The mentors provide training in a number of life skill areas, personal hygiene amenities and financial literacy (promoting regular savings).

Recreational facilities and cultural activities are also available at the Child Protection centers. For older children, vocational training is provided. The Alkhidmat Foundation also works to facilitate the 'next step' for the children, for instance, arranging job placementsor helping them into the mainstream education system.

- Outreach services will be provided to reduce the risk of the direct beneficiaries falling back into dangerous situations. Counselling is available to the families of the children in the project.
- 4. The center works collaboratively with other organizations to ensure that street and working children are able to access the full range of services, to which they are entitled to (government health care services, linking children to Alkhidmat Foundation Muwakhat micro-finance), and to raise awareness about the problems children, face. Al-Falah Scholarship is also awarded to meritorious students to support higher education in different fields.




