ABOUT PLANE

PLATFORM for the NEEDY (PLANE) is a Non-Governmental Organization, NOT for profit operating in the Kabarole district and Fort Portal Tourism City, Rwenzori region, Western Uganda.

We advocate and protect children and women's rights through provision of prevention and multidisciplinary intervention in investigation and information dissemination through radio drama and outreaches so as to have a health -violence free society.

The organization also helps transform the lives of the disadvantaged populations in Kabarole district and Fort Portal Tourism City, Rwenzori region, Western Uganda through empowerment programs, human rights advocacy, and health and literacy promotion so that they can have a better quality of life.

PLANE focuses on general health awareness promotion, social security, and economic empowerment for teenage mothers, preventing violence against children and women, human rights promotion, and mitigating the impact of violence against children and the youth and other related interventions.

PLANE implements programs aimed at educational support to orphans and vulnerable children by providing scholastic materials and school fees.

Founded in 2010, PLANE is registered with the **Uganda National NGO Board No. INDR11119949NB** The organization has developed potential capacity and recognition in enhancing Health promotion Programs, advocacy for the protection of children's rights with emphasis on girl child education, Youth and Teenage Mothers Empowerment, caring and improving lives of vulnerable children and ensuring a well-equipped and knowledgeable farming community.

Legal Status & Registration:

PLATFORM for the NEEDY is responding call for expression of interest to advocate for the protection of children's rights, to help meet their basic needs and to expand their opportunities to reach their full potential.

PLANE is one of the national charity agencies in the country operating in Ruwenzori region set up in 2010 and registered at the national level (under NGO Bureau) in 2014 operating under the NGO Act of 2006. PLANE is member of Girls not Bride Uganda (GNBU) alliance a fraternity that is focused on fighting teenage pregnancy and early marriages in Uganda.

The Initiative is an incorporated charitable entity based in Uganda in East Africa.

Primarily PLANE is into charitable work mainly children and women rights protection and SGBV prevention, Educational support. HIV prevention and Sexual Reproductive Health, Livelihood and economic empowerment, Environmental conservation and Water, sanitation and hygiene.

PLANE is run by a group of professionals dedicated to support the underserved and vulnerable populations in Uganda. PLANE has a dedicated board of 7 members and 5 Trustees supported the secretariat/management team of staff (7) and core volunteers, Global Ambassadors and other volunteers with technical expertise who support field level interventions and partnerships.

PROGRAMMATIC ACTIVIES 2022

1.0 FAMILY CLINIC PROGRAM:

PLATFORM for the NEEDY (PLANE) PLANE initiated the Family Clinic Radio Project. The talk shows run every Monday from 10:00pm-1:00am on Voice of Tooro radio 101 FM in Fort Portal Tourism City, Western Uganda.

In the Family Clinic Radio Project, PLANE hosts different resource persons to create awareness and educate the public on the rights of children, importance of education, land rights, Youth and Women Empowerment programs, HIV/AIDS, Family Planning, Domestic Violence mitigation measures, good nutrition, Malaria prevention, among other health and social–economic issues.

• Why family clinic?

• A family or a community is the center where most health, social, legal, environmental and other problems emerge. This program was designed to help the family to discern and solve such issues in a more localized manner.

Goal:

• To enable families/communities to clearly access critical information and generate local solutions to their problems.

In the Financial year 2022, a total of 38 Radio talk shows were carried out tackling a range of topics with the aim o solving societal problems and building broken families and communities.

Unlike the previous year when we focused mainly on health especially covid 19, this year we focused much on disease control and prevention, Domestic violence and reproductive health issues, financial literacy and empowerment for youth and women.

OUTCOMES:

- Registered a deduction in women and Children human rights violation.
- Reduced incidences to orphans and Children property grabbing.
- The number of clients or people accessing our services has increased.
- A good number of couples embroiled in conflicts and misunderstandings have been counseled and have seen peace in families.
- Many people have been able to be offered guidance and counselling on phone.
- Improved couple relationship at least by 60 percent
- Feedback and responses to people's have been done
- The feedback through phone calls gives us a direction to make strategies on how to solve community problems.

- Increased awareness and understanding of the community issues.
- Increased community participation.

ECONOMIC EMPOWERNMENT

Economic empowerment is one of the three (3) major pillars of our operations. During the COVID-19 pandemic era and its associated effects on human, economic, educational and health systems, combined with climate shocks, food crises and confusion, set back progress made towards gender equality were this exacerbated access to economic opportunities for women and girls especially those who were not involved in formal jobs.

In a bid to find a solution, PLANE embarked on training the youth to equip them with knowledge and skills on solving youth unemployment.

This year, we conducted 08 (eight youth conferences) on sexual reproductive health, financial literacy, setting up small income generating activities, farming, rabbit keeping, poultry as well as business knowledge so as to enable to bridge the knowledge and skills gap towards economic independence.

2.0 RADIO DRAMA PROJECT:

The radio drama project has been on since 2013 and it has created impact on the mindset of the people in the Rwenzori region and Mid-Western.

PLANE started the idea of a drama group called **"BAHEMUKA"** literary meaning **"I'm ashamed!"** The drama is aimed at creating awareness among the people on issues of Domestic Violence mitigation , Children and Women Rights Violation, HIV/AIDS, Family Planning, Conflicts and peace building, economic empowerment and service delivery among other issues of public concern that need urgent attention.

The drama group consisting of 25 characters rehearsals and records the skits in local languages (Rutooro & Runyankorre Rukiga) that are played on VOT 101 FM from Monday -Friday 6:00am-6:30am The listeners are given an opportunity to interact and comment on the drama episode being aired hence promoting listeners' participation and problem solving. A total of 7 (seven) plays were scripted and aired this year. The topics included but not limited to Domestic Violence, Children and Women Rights Violation, HIV/AIDS, Family Planning and manageable families, Conflicts and peace building, economic empowerment and service delivery and corruption; mistreatment of the elderly persons; among other issues of public concern that need urgent attention.

This financial year 2022 in partnership we Rwenzori Anti-Corruption Coalition (RAC) we produced plays about **"Women Participation in Leadership and** *Monitoring of Government programs, human rights violations and referrals".*

Our Bahemuka drama group also performed in outreaches in Kaswa trading center, Busoro Sub County, Kabarole district, Butebe trading center in North division Fort Portal city, Nyaika hotel in Central division during the Anti-Corruption week and Kakinga trading center in Rwimi Town council, Bunyangabu district. These plays were aimed at sensitizing the communities their role in monitoring government programs and encouraging women to participate in leadership and monitoring roles so as to have better service delivery.

OUTCOMES:

- Our engagement with listeners has increased.
- The number of the listeners increased. Every day we receive new members.
- Increased areas of reach in the region.
- Increased number of people and satisfied users testifying how the drama touches and transforms them.
- Promoted co-existence in communities hence reduction of Family conflicts and violence.
- cases of Domestic Violence reduced and this is according the number of callers testifying
- The number of people seeking for information and referrals has also increased.
- .During our outreaches a good number of students and community members appreciate our services.
- Community members and students say they listen and learn a lot from the drama.
- People empowered to demand their services.
- Increased number of people interested to join our BAHEMUKA drama group.

3.0 SEXUAL REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH RIGHTS EDUCATION

PLANE started this program of Sexual Reproductive Health Rights Education after realizing that many children in school were dropping out, engaging in early pregnancies and forced into teenage marriages by their parents and relatives.

Under this program PLANE in partnership with Voice

of Tooro 101 fm organized conferences for the youth to sensitize them on topics of career guidance; Sexual Reproductive Health Rights; Financial Literacy and IT tools and how to use the Social media profitably. These conferences are always organized in the holidays with the aim of attracting a good number of youth both in school and out of school.

3.1 OUR EVERY HOUR MATTERS CAMPAIGN PROJECT:

HOUR MATTERS CAMPAIGN YOUTH EQUIP WITH DEFENSIVE SKILLS

PLATFORM for the NEEDY (PLANE) started the implementation of the Every Hour Matters Campaign. In this campaign, PLANE equips the youth with skills to access post- rape care at health facilities. This, in line with the Every Hour Matters campaign that aims at increasing awareness about the critical importance of quickly accessing post rape care.

The campaign calls for national and community leaders to ensure comprehensive services are available in all communities. PLANE observes that most youth lack access to information about reproductive health. There is need for youths to prioritize the every hour matters campaign to access post rape care services like PEP and Emergency pills at the nearest health facility to prevent HIV and unwanted pregnancies. Today millions of people including girls and adolescents in Uganda are subjected to sexual violence by friends, relatives or members of the community. This vice exposes them to risks of acquiring HIV and unwanted pregnancies. This, if not controlled, ruins their future. Despite the high rates of rape and defilement, many adolescents are not aware that survivors of sexual violence have only 72 hours to receive post exposure prophylaxis (PEP) to prevent HIV/AIDS. The female survivors have 120 hours to receive emergency contraception (EC) to prevent pregnancy. PLANE conducted education trainings in schools to creat awareness on access to PEP and emergency pills in case of rape and defilement.

LESSONS LEARNT:

Kebirungi Harriet a youth from Buheesi said that the training helped her to understand the availability of the services at health facilities. She further advised fellow girls to stick to their goals, listen to their parents and avoid peer groups that may spoil their future Ruyonga Enock a resident of Kiyombya and the head prefect Kahinju secondary school said he was motivated by the training, learnt how to identify himself with the family back ground and become innovative.

According to violence against children surveys, (VSCS) led by CDC globally, 25% of girl's first sexual intercourse was physically forced or coerced, and the majority of cases happened before the age of 16.

LESSONS LEARNT:

- Increased knowledge on the access of PEP and Emergency Pills for post rape care
- Increased knowledge on sexual reproductive health
- Increased knowledge on protected sex
- Reduced cases of early pregnancies.
- Reduced cases of school dropout in schools
- Improvement of students/pupils'
 responsibilities
- Peer-to Peer Health groups formed
- Improved academic performance and decision making.
- Teachers have started sexual education sessions at least once a week
- Improved identification of issues to discuss on during the education health conferences.

CHALLENGES IDENTIFIED IN THE FIELD

- Many students revealed they have never heard of PEP and availability of these services.
- Many said they fear to talk to their teachers on issues of sexual education and Reproductive rights

• Students disclosed that most teachers have no time to attend to students' issues especially reproductive health issues. Their focus is on academics.

• Some teachers shy away to talk to students about issues of reproductive health.

• Teachers revealed that students value information from external educators than their teachers.

• Students noted that parents don't talk to them about sexual reproductive health.

• Career guidance education is required in schools to prepare the students.

3.2 OUR DREAMS PROJECT: Teenage Pregnancies; Early Marriages A Nightmare

In our Dreams Project; PLANE came up with the idea of writing poems on teenage pregnancies and early marriages following a rise in the cases of teenage pregnancies and early marriages during the Covid 19 pandemic.

We partnered with Dr. Elizabeth a writer based in the Netherlands.


The books were to be distributed to the schools both primary and secondary to enable them read and understand the problem and how to prevent and avoid the vices that affected their education and their future life.

Our goal was that we wanted everyone in Uganda who is concerned about the issues of teenage pregnancy and child brides to know that their concern is understood and addressed.

Girls deserve a childhood, an education, and a long life of freedom.

The writing is enjoyable and important because when we reach out to help there is a cascade of positivity. Writing poems is our way to share the modest wisdom we have.

PLANE hopes to spread the message and transform the communities. It is not someone's fault for having a difficult life but a simple thing like a poem or education can change a life and a whole community. To our children and youth... We're so excited for you to explore this booklet and experience the way that poetry can make a difference in your life. We truly hoped that this would encourage them to take responsibility for their own life and those around them. We hoped that it would encourage them to make the best decision for themselves. Reading this booklet would hopefully open their eyes and give them some perspective around adolescent sexual practices, teenage pregnancy and early marriage. It would show them that their life has far more potential and that they focus on their health and school... they would have a strong and successful future.

OUTCOME:

- Reduced cases of teenage pregnancies and early marriages
- Equipped the students and children with the information to understand the problem and take right decisions.
- Improvement of teachers in handling and responding to the students issues.
- Teachers got the skills of handling and integrating education in their teaching.
- Teachers helped with teaching/learning materials on prevention of teenage and early marriages.
- Teachers and children acknowledged the problem and its solutions.
- Improved relationship and coordination between PLANE and the partner schools

OUTCOMES:

- Increased knowledge of the financial literacy skills
- Increased knowledge on sexual reproductive health
- Increased knowledge on protected sex
- Reduced cases of early pregnancies.
- Reduced cases of school dropout in schools
- Improvement of students/pupils' responsibilities
- Peer-to Peer Health groups formed that is to say Whatsapp group
- Improved academic performance and decision making.
- Teachers have started sexual education sessions every Friday
- Improved identification of issues to discuss on every holiday.

CHALLENGES IDENTIFIED IN THE FIELD

- Many students revealed they fear to talk to their teachers on issues of sexual education and Reproductive rights
- Most teachers have no time to attend to students' issues especially reproductive health issues. Their focus is on academics.
- Some teachers shy away to talk to students about issues of reproductive health.

• Students revealed parents don't talk to them about sexual reproductive health.

• Career guidance education is required in schools to prepare the students.

2.0 ORPHANS EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP:

Under this program of orphan education sponsorship, many vulnerable children approach our office requesting for assistance to be included on the program.

Over 200 needy children and orphans have approached our office seeking for support and to be included on the program.

But because of lack of funding out of this number, PLANE was able to sponsor 105 children providing them with scholastic materials such as exercise books, pens, pencils, soap, bags, uniforms and tuition/fees and other personal requirements to enable them access quality education

2.1 COMMMUNITY EDUCATION PROJECT:

Community Education Project was initiated after Peato Wangweera 17-years old high school student in Massachusetts; USA but a citizen of Thailand picked interest to support the vulnerable children in Uganda.

Peato is passionate about volunteering and he decided to volunteer at PLATFORM for the NEEDY (PLANE) as a software Developer where he assisted many local Community Based Organizations to create websites for them.

Being generous about the underprivileged children; Peato started a fundraiser on GoFundMe to raise funds worth \$15, 000 to help 200 needy Ugandan children who were detrimentally affected by the Covid 19 pandemic hindering their access to education. But only \$1750 was collected. Many children suffered after their parents went unemployed during Covid-19.

While some were sleeping on a single meal, the majority were unable to go back to school when the government reopened educational facilities on January 10, 2022. Despite the government commitment to open schools, many vulnerable children were unable to go back to school since most lacked educational materials and other basic needs. This is mainly due to closure of business and the lock-down where most parents and guardian before the lock-down survived on subsistence means. The advent of the lock down worsened their economic situation and this will take time to recover from such a situation. Worse, the present prices for commodities have increased making it extremely difficult for families of these children to meet the basic needs.

Luckily, Peato set the fund-raising campaign with the hope to attract support to the needy children by providing them with educational materials, including exercise books, pens, pencils, soap, jelly, uniforms, shoes, food and tuition/fees.

Peato was later joined by his loving mother Anna Boonteang who mobilized donations and support from good Samaritans and well-wishers from her community in Thailand to help Peato and PLANE fulfill the children's dreams to have a brighter future that is fully empowered.

2.2. AIM OF THE CAMPAIGN:

• To support the 200 most vulnerable children to access educational support (scholastic materials that include boos, pens, pencils, soap, uniform, bags and fees/tuition) to further their education in nurseries, primaries, secondary and vocational schools.

• To promote improved stay in schools and access to education amongst the vulnerable children.

2.3 PLANNED ACTIVITIES

• Identification of more project beneficiaries from the community targeting the most needy children to benefit from this Community Education Project

• Mobilize resources and fundraise to raise \$15,000 to support 200 needy children

• Distribute scholastic materials and fees to 200 children

• Continue orientation of the parents and guardians about the project, the sponsors and their continued support of their children.

• Visit the benefiting children in their homes and have their stories.

• Hold meetings with the sponsors to brief them about the progress of the project

• To meet and request the sponsor Peato and madam Varanya Boonteang to be our Ambassadors in Thailand to always mobilize resources and fundraise for the needy children for the sustainability of this project.

• To prepare and share the report with the sponsor and other stakeholders.

• Provide video documentary of the beneficiaries talking about the project impact.

• Monitor the learning and performance of the beneficiaries in schools

• Provide the funders with accountabilities.

2.4. PROJECT ACHIEVEMENTS

• PLANE registered 127 most needy children to benefit under this Community Education Support project. But the first phase only 68 children benefited because the resources were not enough.

• Received funds from Peato and Anna Varanya Boonteang to support the children under this project.

• We received \$1955 from Peato and his mom Boonteang and we spent \$ 1886 on the purchase of scholastic materials and fees to children.

• Held a meeting with Peato and Boonteang requested them to be our Ambassadors in Thailand and they humbly accepted to continue supporting the organization.

• Purchased the goodies and distributed them to the beneficiaries on Friday 19th August December at St.Peter & Paul's Primary school Virika Fort Portal tourism city

• Produced Reports and accountabilities and submitted to funders.

• Videos of beneficiaries' talking about the project were produced and submitted to the funders.

LESSONS LEARNT

• Small contributions to vulnerable cchildren can be appreciated and can be a turning point in improving the lives of vulnerable children and their care takers/Parents.

• Some disaster can be detrimental to the economy affecting especially the neediest communities, their livelihoods and access to social services.

• Working with the local leaders to identify the most vulnerable children to benefit reduces bias especially where the selection criteria is well known to the leaders and community members.

2.4 CHALLENGES

• Out of the 200 children we had target only 58 benefited.

• Our targeted goal \$15000 wasn't yet realised to enable 200 children access scholastic materials at ago. Fortunately, the fund-raising campaign is still ongoing.

• Overwhelming number of children who come to our office seeking for assistance.

• Overwhelming number of teenage mothers due to COVID-19 in need of rehabilitation and support with income generating projects.

• The number of needy children has since increased to 127 including those in secondary and vocation training institutions.

4.0 FUTURE PLAN:

• We plan to meet Peato and Mom Varanya to discuss on how to recruit volunteers and Ambassadors to help her establish a permanent network of Thailand PLANE Ambassadors/ volunteers for the sustainability of the project

• Plan to invite Peato; his mom and their community members to come and visit Uganda; interact with the project beneficiaries to discover for themselves the problems facing the children in Uganda.

• Want to expand our partnerships with Thailand and USA communities and other countries.

• We plan to visit Thailand to see and interact with Peato; madam Varanya and her community that is supporting this project to get the opportunity to explain to them PLANE mission and programs and also appreciate them for the amazing work done of supporting the children in Uganda.

5.0 CONCLUSION

By and Large, the initial phase of the project was successful, appreciated by both parents/guardian and the local leaders. With intensified resource mobilization, PLANE hopes to scale up the number of beneficiaries and also sustain support for quite some time.

OUTCOMES:

- Improved Stress reduction on the guardians.
- A strategy to the kids' bright future.
- Reduced on school dropout rate.
- Restoration of hope to underprivileged children.
- Improved relationship, coordination between PLANE, children and their guardians.

5. YOUNG MOTHERS EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

Under this program of the Young Mothers Empowerment Program (YMEP) PLANE mobilizes the Teenage mothers in groups and equips them with knowledge and skills on income generating projects, Savings and Credit skills, nutrition of their children and Reproductive Health issues like Family Planning and Manageable families.

During this F/Y 2022 PLANE conducted two trainings on Financial literacy ; Savings and Credit, good home sanitation, nutrition of children ; urban farming and engagement in income generating activities to increase on their household home income.

We didn't have any fund to help in skilling the teenager out of school.

6. CHARITABLE PROJECT

PLANE as a charity organization we have been conducting charitable fundraising events to raise funds to help the vulnerable people with complex illness.

In the year 2022 we organized a campaign and raised funds to help Tugume Joseph of Kinyankende, Mugusu sub county Kabarole district. Joseph aged 25 had eye complication and needed Three Million Five Hundred Thousand shillings only (3.5m). In partnership with Voice of Toro 101 FM we launched a fundraiser to mobilize the people on radio and managed to collect 1.8m and he was operated in Mbarara Ruharo eye hospital. He was successfully operated and he is now feeling fine.

PLANE also took part in the fundraising for Fort Portal councilor Hon. Bernard Ategeka a resident of Katumba , Kacwamba ward , Central division.

Bernard needed Sixty five million shillings (sh65m) for HIPS replacement at Kumi Orthopedic hospital. We used the radio to mobilize resources through our Family Clinic Radio program that runs every Monday 10:00pm-1:00am. We also secured airtime in the morning and mid-morning programs on VOT to mobilize the people for support. Bernard has the most successful operation on both legs .He invited PLANE for a thanks giving ceremony at his aunties place in Katumba.

We also fundraised Patrick Muhumuza of Busoro who required three million shillings for the construction of a pit latrine and a kitchen. Patrick is blind and he lost his sight when four years due to measles.

- Improved on mobilization skills.
- Improved confidence in our services.

There are many organizations but they don't reach out the intended groups of people. I am pleased to associate with such an organization that reaches the people in rural areas and tackling issues of Gender Based Violence, family planning, HIV/AIDS, nutrition among others.

PLANE's campaign of "**Every Hour Matters**" joining the global partners will help in reducing the high rate and prevalence of the teenage pregnancies and HIV infection.

Many of our girls have got pregnant and dropped out of school while young and others get infected with HIV but this campaign will prevent them from acquiring the infection since they can access the post rape services at our health facilities. We know that youth lack information and as district ad partners we shall continue to sensitize them so that they get the information. I appreciate PLANE for the initiative.

Abdullah, "I've both my parents but my dad has sickly. Despite the sickness they are poor and can't raise money for the tuition. I struggled to get funds for my Ordinary level. Thank God that I passed all the science subjects and in second grade. I scored 33 aggregates but when the results came, my heart was filled with thoughts and prayed to God to create for me away. I was in Bahemuka drama as an actor and I approached the organization seeking for support and I go to a nursing school. But, it was not easy because they never had that much amount for the nursing course.

The director advised me to go for Advanced Level (high school) but still I had no hope of getting the fees. PLANE restored my hope when they offered me fees for my first term at Kahinju secondary school and pledged to continue helping me.

Jolly, "As youth we have been neglected in terms of engagement in government programs. We also lack information because our leaders don't come back in our villages to inform us and update of the developments. It has given us a platform .I have learnt something new from PLANE that the youth can form groups and access government funds at low interest rate. Also I thank them for the sexual education health talk that empowers us as youth especially females to guard against the unwanted pregnancies. 


Joseph Kiiza a youth from Mbuzi

DATA

PLANE through her programs has been able to impact on 245 lives of people directly, 127 children and over 50, 000 indirectly through the civic education radio programs; drama; trainings; outreaches in schools and conferences for the year 2022. And we're hopeful and prayerful that God will help us reach more people and transform their mindset change and their lives directly and indirectly.

ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE YEAR 2022:

• We have continued to partnership with National and local NGOs.

• Maintained the good working relationship with the Kabarole district and Fort Portal city.

• Provided scholastic materials and tuition to our children and we are glad one of our children is in S.6 doing PCB/M.

• Radio talks on Family Clinic and radio drama were conducted as scheduled. And the

audience has increased and a good number of panelists is joining us for the talkshows.

• Our generous and hardworking volunteers received awards for the amazing extra ordinary and excellent work done.

• The organization was able to register for online donation system with Flutterwave. We can now receive online donations. We extend our thanks to madam Vyapti Subra our Ambassadorship in USA who helped us to do the registration. We are now eligible to receive donations globally.

• Website domain <u>www.platformfortheneedy.</u> org space was purchased and now it can accommodate more information.

• Madam Vyapti our volunteer/ambassador has continued to help us updating the website regularly and she has upgraded it.

• We have got a good number of volunteers to design social media posts and maintaining social media platforms

• Conducted onsite fundraising for three people with complex diseases. They needed funds to access treatment.

CHALLENGES:

• High expectations from the beneficiaries as many people want their children to study free without contributing.

• Limited funding to reach out the targeted audience in rural communities and implementation of our programs.

• Limited funds to facilitate the panelists for the Family Clinic Radio talk show every Monday.

• We haven't got a reliable partner to fund our program activities.

• We have failed to attract a sponsor for the Family Clinic Radio program and the drama.

• PLANE through voice of Tooro is getting an overwhelming number of people seeking support to fundraise for them to raise funds for treatment of the complex diseases such as heart diseases, kidney, cancer and eye diseases.

ORGANIZATION PLANNED ACTIVITIES 2023:

• School outreaches; PLANE plans to carry out school outreaches in both primary and secondary. We shall have sessions on health advocacy, and mental well-being and career guidance with young boys and girls in schools.

• We shall also educate them on the issue of teenage pregnancies and early marriages and Every Hour Matters Campaign.

• Start a Campaign dubbed Greening Uganda Schools. We shall plant trees in selected schools and educate them on the importance of conservation of environment hence mitigating the effects of climate change.

• Girl Leadership Trainings: We shall continue with youth conferences and trainings to transform the mindset of girls and boys through empowering them with hands on skills and information that enables them to lead, thrive and live violence free lives where they can ably exercise and have control over their lives.

• PLANE, this years wants to improve on social marketing since we have the international Brand Ambassadors and volunteers to attract more partners.

• Improve on the local resource mobilization to raise funds. Local fundraisings for the complex illnesses.

• Intensify on community dialogues and drama performance in rural communities.

• Continue with Proposal writing and lobbying for funding.

• PLANE shall continue supporting a manageable number of school going children with scholastic materials and fees whenever support is available.
