Through targeted fundraising efforts, we donate tickets annually to partner nonprofits, such as The Family Resource Center, Head Start, and Nana Baby Home, who utilize and distribute them to children in need. Early childhood literacy programs and outreach programs are offered at no cost to the underserved families they reach.



The Museum Inclusion Fund also provides scholarships for museum programs, offering children of various ages the opportunity to engage in memorable experiences with their peers. Furthermore, the museum actively participates in the Museums for All program, which offers reduced admission fees to visitors presenting an Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card or the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) card, ensuring that individuals facing financial barriers can access and enjoy the museum's exhibits and programs at a discounted rate, promoting inclusivity and accessibility for all.
