Over 1000 students and common people including children and security man have died since July 14 in clashes with anti-racism student movement in our country. More than 20000 people were injured. On the other hand, the resources of important places of the country have been burnt to ashes. which are derived from various sources. All in all, about thousands of crores worth of assets have been lost. But life is not worth money. It is important to stand by the families of bereaved and injured persons and provide financial and medical assistance to them. An extreme disaster in the history of Bangladesh is coming. Donor organizations like yours are in dire need of help at this time. Some of the survivors are so damaged that they are crippled for the rest of their lives. Many of those injured will live with disabilities for the rest of their lives. Financial support is needed to stand by the people of the country at this time of disaster.

PROCUREMENT MANAGEMENT:

The procurement of goods or services will require complete recording and the expenses must be substantiated by proper documentation. Note that expenditure may not be accepted to the management or donor for procurement if those are not budgeted, allowable and reasonable. A procurement procedure must be followed. In case of extreme emergency which prevents to follow the procedure , prior permission must be sorted from the management . Administrative negligence or delays caused by poor management cannot be invoked to skip the normal procedure. The procedures to be followed for procurement of supplies are listed below.

Approval Committee: A list of approval authorities for procurement along with their approval limit should be kept prior to procurement. The Executive Director /Executive Committee of the organization must approve this list.

Procurement committee: The organization should form a procurement committee consisting of at least 2/3 members. The Executive Director and the accountant should not be included in this procurement committee. The Procurement committee will send their recommendations to ED or his/her designated person will finally approved but ED will remain accountable for all procurement.

Reporting System

DDEF Follow a regular and systematic reporting process using different monitoring and format Accounts coordinator collect data and prepared quarterly, half yearly and annual report of the organization. Chief executive /Director verify all information of the reports and presents in the EC meetings and General meetings regularly. . Every donor give their prescribe financial format for monthly, quarterly and yearly report. **DDEF** follow all of those format for financial reporting. **DDEF** also prepared trail balance, R&P, income expenditure report and balance sheet every year for face internal, External and Donor Audit. **DDEF** s have no extra computerized Accounting system but they prepared all of report in computer donor prescribe format.

Audit System:

DDEF recruitment of Audit system was very transparent. The project accounts of the organization shall be audited at the end of project or yearly or as to be suggested by concerned donor/funding organization. Children are enrolled for classes I, II and III and are offered non-ormal school course and curriculum coupled with moral development and development awareness in an integrated manner with the objective to develop students, honest and patriotic citizens. After graduation from a feeder school, students are enrolled in Class IV at nearby government primary school.

Destitute Children's Education Program

This is an Education Program Children'for the Ultra-poor children especially dwelling in slum areas within Barisal City Corporation. The project has been designed to cover 100 boys and girls of 5-12 years of age with about 50:50 ratio

from among the dropout boys and girls, out-of-school boys and girls, child labors, orphans and disabled children etc. This program is similar to that of feeder school program so long as course design, class lesson, evaluation etc are concerned. But, under this program, some additional supports are offered besides education including: nutrition support in the form of light lunch/snacks, health care support, sanitation support, support for educational materials, school dress, school bag and development awareness for parents/guardians.

Health Care Program

The main objectives of this program are to provide health awareness through holding health sessions, to provide medical prescription through qualified physician, to provide diagnosis service, physiotherapy, nutrition and life saving medicines free of cost.
