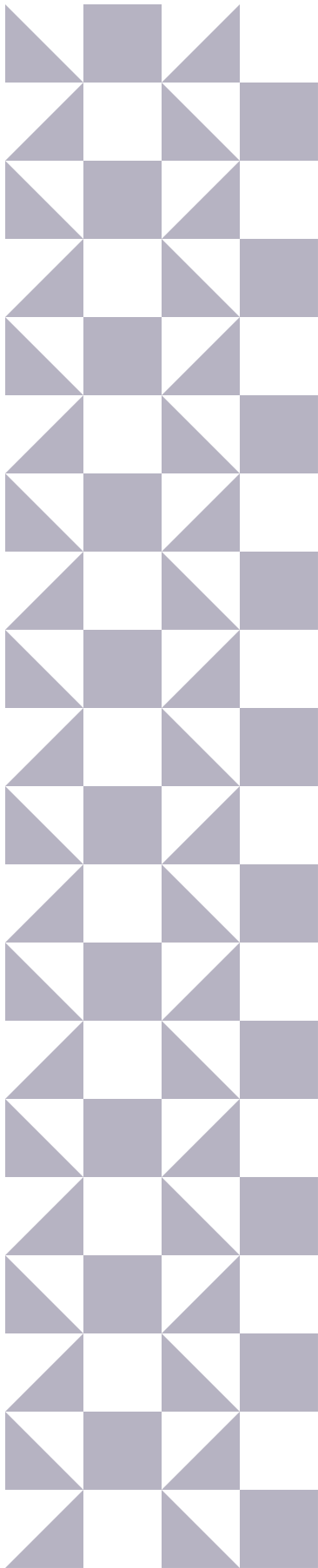

The Challenge Facing Girls in Rural Nigeria

In rural and low-income communities across Nigeria, thousands of girls never set foot in a classroom. Early marriage, farm labor, household chores, and street vending rob them of the chance to learn — trapping families in a cycle of poverty for generations.

1000s of girls in rural and low-income Nigeria have never entered a classroom — denied their right to education before it begins.



Why Education Is Out of Reach



For families living in poverty across rural Nigeria, the true cost of education is overwhelming. Tuition fees, school uniforms, and textbooks represent expenses that are simply unaffordable — forcing parents to make an impossible choice between daily survival and their daughter's future.

"When a family cannot afford a uniform or a single textbook, the classroom door remains closed — not by choice, but by circumstance. Financial barriers, not lack of ambition, keep thousands of girls out of school every year."

- Textbooks and writing materials provided to ensure every student is ready to learn

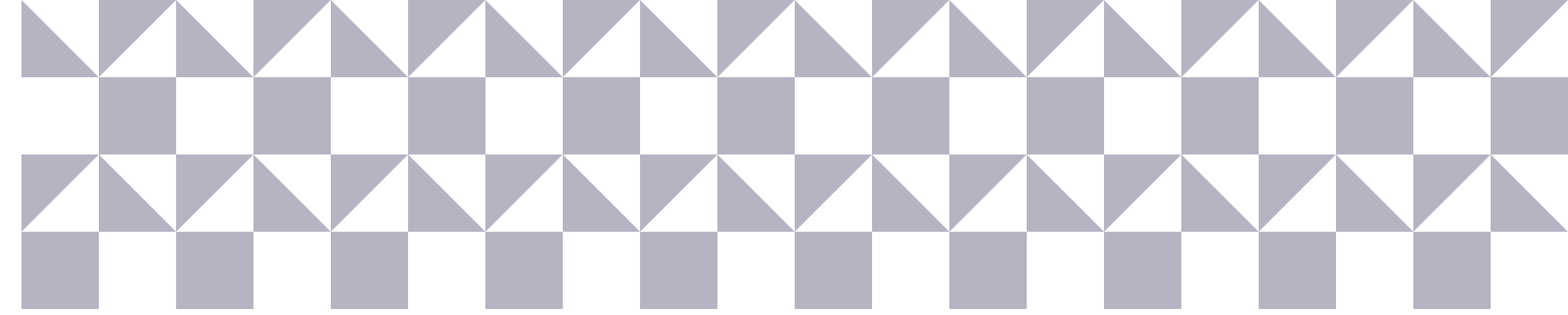


Who We Are Supporting



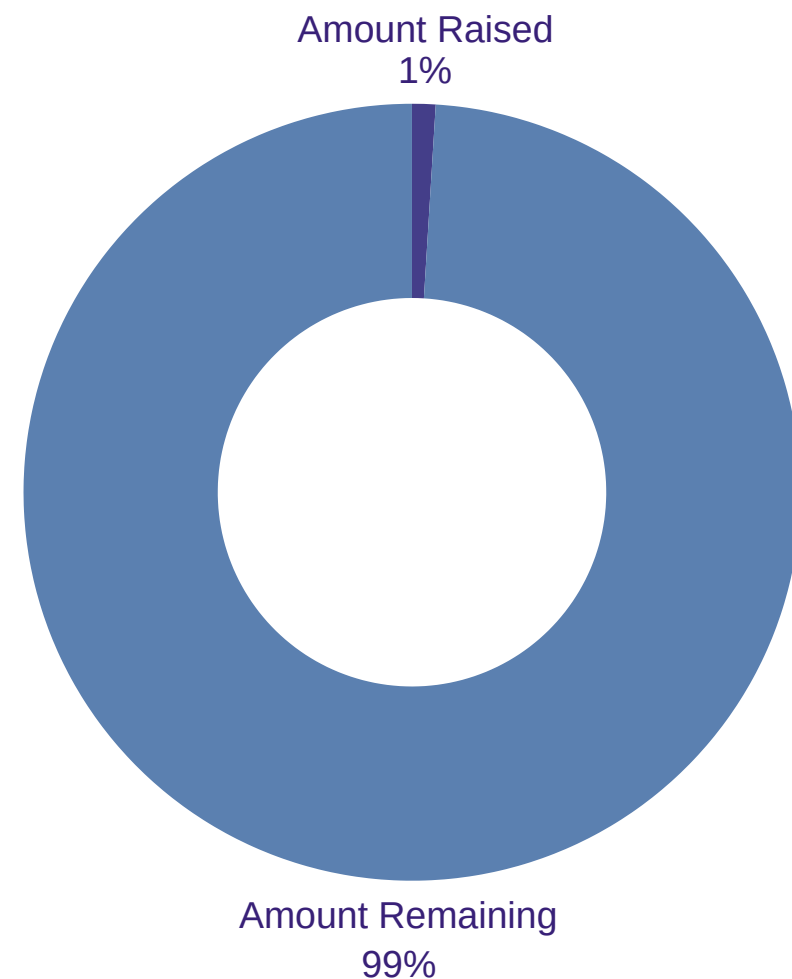
2,500 girls from low-income families across rural and urban-poor communities in Nigeria — many of whom have never set foot in a classroom or received any formal education.

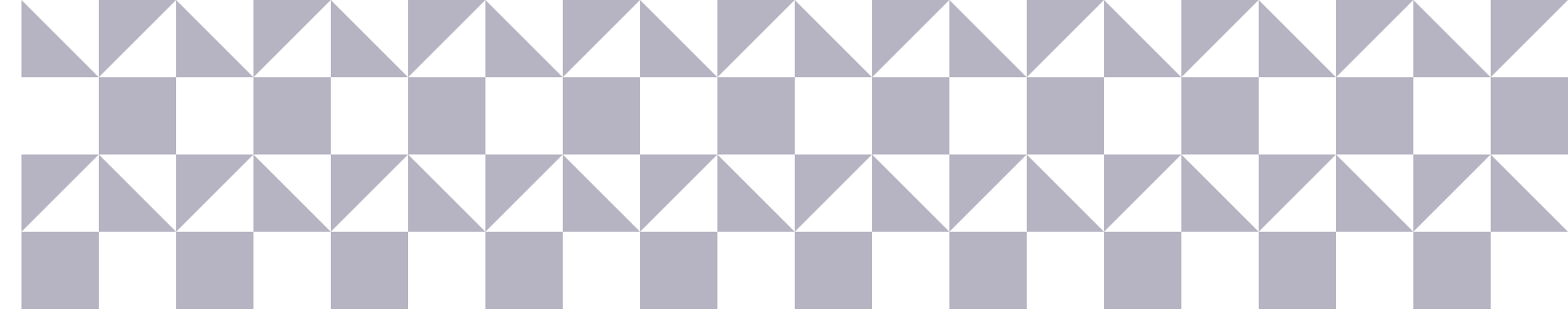


Fundraising Goal & Current Status

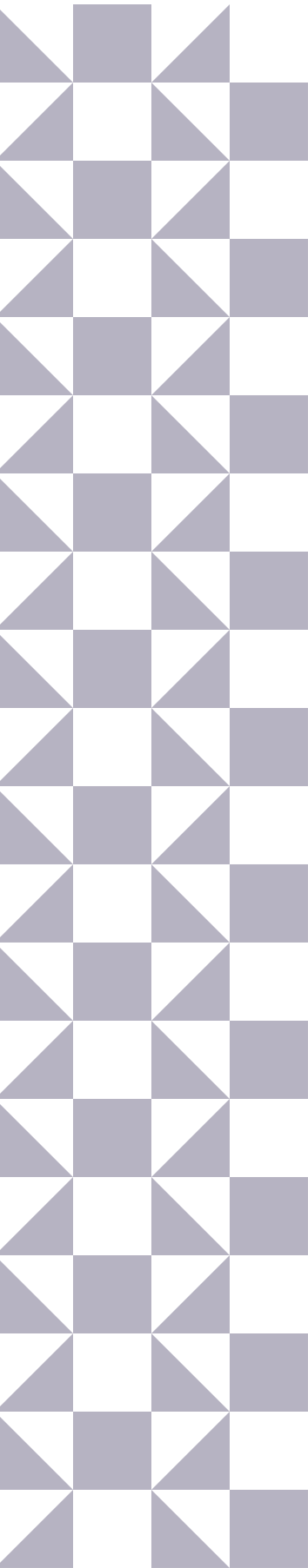
