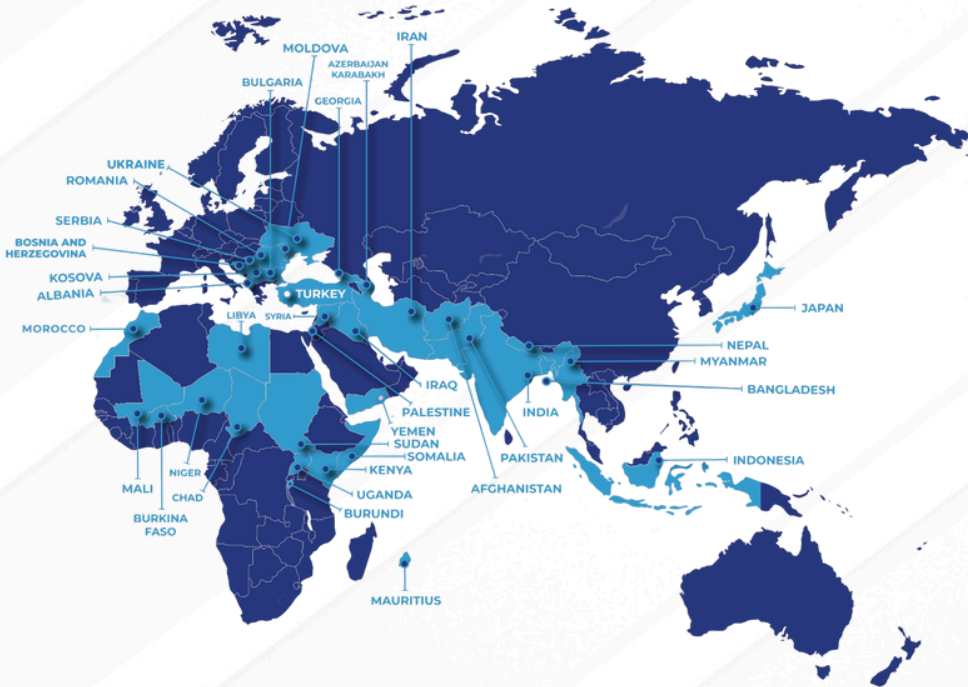
About IBC

SUDAN SITUATION OVERVIEW

In 2025, 305 million people around the world will require urgent humanitarian assistance and protection, as multiple crises escalate with devastating consequences for the people affected by them. The Southern and Eastern Africa region hosts the highest number of people in need (85 million), with the catastrophic crisis in Sudan accounting for 35 per cent of the total in the region.

Following 20 months of relentless conflict, Sudan has become one of the world's largest and most severe humanitarian crises with nearly two-thirds of the population in desperate need of assistance. Sudan is one of the world's worst hunger crises with nearly 26 million people facing acute hunger and famine, with famine confirmed in ZamZam IDP Camp, in North Darfur. With nearly 11 million internally displaced persons and another 3 million people having fled into neighbouring countries, Sudan is now the world's largest displacement crisis.

The region continues to grapple with major diseases including cholera, malaria and measles. At least two-thirds of Sudan's 18 states are facing multiple disease outbreaks like cholera, malaria, and measles and others amid a collapsed public healthcare system and this is exacerbating the humanitarian crisis. The lack of access to healthcare services across the country means that 5 million people, including children under the age of five and pregnant women, will face a heightened threat of death.

According to the latest Sudan Mobility Update by the International Organization for Migration (IOM), approximately 10.1 million people are internally displaced across all 18 states of Sudan, while an additional 4.1 million individuals have fled to neighboring countries such as Chad, South Sudan, Egypt, Ethiopia, Libya, the Central African Republic, and Uganda.

In parallel with this situation, the state capital of North Darfur, Al Fasher, has become a critical flashpoint in the conflict, enduring relentless fighting and near-daily shelling. The violence has forced thousands of people to flee to already overstretched surrounding areas. Insecurity has severely restricted humanitarian access, making it increasingly difficult to deliver life-saving assistance. With shortages of food, water, and medical supplies mounting, the situation in Al Fasher is edging dangerously close to a full-scale humanitarian catastrophe.

Malnutrition remains critically high. In 2025, an estimated 2.1 million children under age 5 will face acute malnutrition, and 1.1 million pregnant and lactating women will require treatment for acute malnutrition. The economic crisis is exacerbating this issue, with a projected 33 per cent increase in children experiencing severe acute malnutrition in 2025.





IBC SUDAN PROJECTS

EMERGENCY FOOD RESPONSE

Since 2021, IBC has been providing emergency food assistance to Sudanese families and internally displaced persons (IDPs). Closely monitoring the socio-economic crisis in the region, IBC has responded rapidly to the growing needs. Concrete steps have been taken to address the food insecurity faced by millions of Sudanese struggling to survive amidst the ongoing conflict. As part of its emergency relief efforts, IBC delivered food parcels during Ramadan and distributed meat during Eid al-Adha, reaching more than one thousand families who were forced to flee to the outskirts and rural areas of Khartoum. These interventions have provided vital support for families who have lost access to basic necessities. By sustaining such targeted interventions, IBC continues to alleviate hunger and strengthen resilience among the most vulnerable communities affected by Sudan's protracted crisis.

Closely following the developments in Sudan, IBC, in collaboration IDRf Canada, took action to find solutions to the food problem of the Sudanese people who are struggling to survive in the grip of hunger. It distributed food packages during Ramadan and meat during Eid al-Adha to over a thousand families who had to flee to the outskirts and villages of Khartoum due to the ongoing conflict.

Malnutrition remains at critical levels. In 2025, an estimated 2.1 million children under the age of five are expected to face acute malnutrition, while 1.1 million pregnant and lactating women will require treatment for acute malnutrition. The ongoing economic crisis is further exacerbating this situation, with projections indicating a 33 per cent increase in the number of children suffering from severe acute malnutrition in 2025.

Looking ahead, IBC aims to strengthen its operations in the region, sustain its efforts, and develop new projects to address the growing humanitarian needs.
