



PROJECT DOCUMENTATION — Helping Children and Elderly in Winter Crisis

Project Overview

This project aims to provide urgent winter assistance to multichild families and isolated elderly individuals living in extreme poverty in rural Georgia. Many of these households lack heating, winter food supplies, and access to essential medicines. Winters are severe, and without immediate intervention, vulnerable children and seniors face life-threatening conditions.

The Problem

Large low-income families cannot secure basic winter necessities such as heating fuel, warm clothing, and nutritious food. Elderly individuals living alone face even greater hardship, with no means to stay warm or buy medicine. limited income, unemployment, and damaged homes make winter survival extremely difficult.

How the Project Provides Solutions

The project delivers life-saving assistance directly to those most at risk:

- Emergency heating materials (wood, gas, briquettes)
- Nutritious winter food packages
- Essential medicines and first-aid items
- Warm clothing and blankets for children and elderly

- On-site visits and assessment by volunteers

Who Benefits

- Large multichild families in rural poverty
- Elderly individuals living alone with no support
- Children with chronic health issues
- Families whose income is insufficient for basic needs

Why This Project Matters

This is not a long-term development program — this is *life-saving winter support*.

Without heating, medicine, or food, winter can become deadly for the most vulnerable.

Timely help prevents illness, hypothermia, hunger, and deeper crisis.
