1. Executive Summary

- AAAJC's initiative to empower youth and women in Tete and Cabo Delgado.
- Focus on climate justice, legal literacy, ecosystem restoration, and community resilience.
- Funding goal: \$100,000 (potential expansion to \$150,000).

2. Organizational Background

- AAAJC: youth-led Mozambican organization focused on justice, climate action, and community resilience.
- Track record of institutional development, international partnerships, and grassroots mentorship.
- Collaboration with Associação Voz do Zambeze, Kuberra, Kuthandiza Azinji, and other youth-led groups.

3. Problem Statement

- Tete: droughts, mining exclusion, and rural marginalization fueling vulnerability.
- Cabo Delgado: displacement from armed violence and climate shocks worsening insecurity.
- Lack of accessible mechanisms for legal protection, climate literacy, and community-led resilience.

4. Project Objectives

- Train youth and women as paralegals and climate facilitators.
- Provide legal literacy and advocacy tools for land rights and justice.
- Restore ecosystems and promote sustainable livelihoods.
- Facilitate community dialogues linking climate justice to cultural memory.
- Document resilience stories and launch advocacy campaigns.

5. Activities & Timeline

- Months 1–3: Training facilitators, preparing legal and climate materials.
- Months 4–6: Launch community workshops and ecosystem restoration activities.
- Months 7–9: Expand to Cabo Delgado, advocacy dialogues, cultural memory projects.
- Months 10–12: Documentation, campaigns, evaluation, and donor reporting.

6. Budget Overview

- Materials and logistics: \$20,000
- Training and workshops: \$30,000
- Ecosystem restoration and sustainable livelihoods: \$25,000
- Legal literacy and advocacy campaigns: \$15,000
- Coordination and monitoring: \$10,000

Total: \$100,000

- Strengthened community resilience against climate shocks.
- Youth and women empowered as paralegals and facilitators.
