3. Organization Mission Statement

Our Mission

Is to safeguard vulnerable communities in the DRC from deadly epidemics through rapid, proactive prevention. We build lasting health security by installing clean water systems, deploying targeted vaccines, and conducting aggressive contact tracing. By partnering with local leaders, we counter misinformation and build community trust, ensuring life-saving health interventions succeed even in active conflict zones.

Project Beneficiaries

Given the hyper-local nature of the **\$500 micro-budget allocation**, the project targets a highly concentrated, high-risk area (such as a single informal Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) camp or a high-density community school) in an epidemic hotspot like North or South Kivu.

The target population is split into two distinct categories:

1. Direct Beneficiaries

These are individuals who directly receive the physical inputs (clean water, hygiene products) and targeted training from the project.

- **200 Schoolchildren and Displaced Youth:** Children under 19 who will have daily access to the newly installed handwashing stations and soap, protecting them directly from **Mpox (Clade Ib)** transmission.
- **150 Vulnerable Households (approx. 900 individuals):** Families living in the immediate vicinity of the water points who will receive the *Aquatabs* water purification tablets to protect them against **Cholera**.
- **5 Local Community Health Volunteers (RECOs):** Local community leaders who receive the communication equipment (megaphones), airtime, transport stipends, and diagnostic training sheets to lead the field response.

2. Indirect Beneficiaries

These are individuals who benefit from the wider protection, reduced transmission rates, and increased awareness generated by the project within the broader community.

- **5,000 Camp or Village Residents:** Community members reached by the door-to-door megaphone awareness campaigns, localized posters, and community radio broadcasts regarding **Ebola-Bundibugyo**, Mpox, and Cholera symptom identification.
- **Local Health Centers:** Healthcare workers in nearby clinics who will experience a reduction in emergency admissions due to early containment at the community level.
- **Cross-Border Traders and Transit Users:** Individuals utilizing neighboring markets or transit hubs who benefit from the suppression of a localized epidemic cluster before it can spread regionally.

Context and Justification of the Project

Context of the Project

- **Emergence of a Complex Strain:** The outbreak is driven by the **Bundibugyo strain**, a rare variant of the Ebola virus for which there is currently **no approved vaccine or specific antiviral treatment**.
- **High-Risk Geographic Zone:** The epidemic is centered along the border regions between the DRC and Uganda, areas characterized by high population density and intense migration linked to cross-border trade.
- **Fragile Healthcare Infrastructure:** Local healthcare facilities critically lack Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), isolation capacities, and rapid diagnostic tests, directly exposing frontline medical workers to high infection rates.

Justification of the Project

- **Immediate Interruption of Transmission:** With no vaccine available, containing the virus relies entirely on rapid case isolation, strict contact tracing, and the deployment of systematic handwashing stations.
- **Prevention of Economic Collapse:** Prolonged quarantines freeze local agriculture and informal markets. Rapid intervention prevents a major food security crisis and the generational impoverishment of affected households.
- **Mitigation of Social Trauma:** The project directly addresses the urgent need to care for thousands of Ebola orphans and combat the severe social stigma facing survivors returning to their communities.
- **Restoration of Community Trust:** Deploying trained local actors ensures that health measures (such as safe and dignified burials) align with cultural traditions, preventing friction between citizens and response authorities.

Main Objective of the Project

The primary objective of the project is to **contain the spread of the Bundibugyo Ebola strain**, lower mortality rates, and **strengthen community resilience** in the border regions of the DRC and Uganda through rapid medical response, localized sanitation, and socio-economic support.

Specific Objectives

- **Interrupt Chains of Transmission:** Establish 100% comprehensive contact tracing and deploy functional, public handwashing stations at major transit hubs within the first 30 days.
- **Protect Frontline Healthcare Workers:** Deliver and maintain a continuous supply of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and rapid testing kits to all localized health clinics in the impact zone.
- **Enhance Safe Patient Management:** Set up secure, culturally respectful isolation units to guarantee dignified care for infected individuals and safe burial protocols.
- **Mitigate Socio-Economic Shock:** Provide immediate food security packages, psychological counseling, and reintegration kits to Ebola survivors, orphans, and deeply affected households.

Mission of the Project

The mission of the project is to **save lives, stop the transmission of the Bundibugyo Ebola virus, and restore dignity** to affected families across the DRC and Uganda by delivering rapid, community-led humanitarian aid, strengthening fragile health infrastructures, and protecting vulnerable populations from systemic collapse.

Core Values of the Project

- **Humanity First:** We place human life, safety, and physical well-being at the center of every intervention, ensuring aid reaches the most isolated and high-risk individuals.
- **Cultural Sensitivity & Respect:** We adapt public health protocols, such as isolation and safe burials, to honor local traditions and foster absolute transparency and mutual trust.
- **Localization & Community Ownership:** We empower and equip local leaders, youth groups, and grassroots organizations to lead response efforts, ensuring long-term resilience.
- **Accountability & Integrity:** We pledge absolute transparency in resource allocation, ensuring that every fund, medical asset, and food kit directly impacts frontline communities.
- **Inclusivity & Equity:** We actively fight social stigma, ensuring survivors, orphans, and marginalized groups receive equal access to medical care, psychological support, and economic recovery.
